Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

On Friday morning we will gather at 10:30am for the 100th anniversary of the landing of Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC) troops at Gallipoli. We remember with great sadness the diggers who made that fateful landing at Anzac Cove. We also commemorate those who have lost their lives in all past wars and recent conflicts and we pray for people across the world who are currently deployed in the quest for peace.

A few years ago I was very fortunate to visit Gallipoli as part of the 'Footsteps of St Paul Pilgrimage' with the Diocese of Parramatta. This photo is of a monument with the words from the first President of Turkey, Mustafa Kemal Ataturk (1934). He sums up the respect that the enemies had for one another and especially for the ANZAC troops.

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HOW ARE WE GOING WITH OUR GOALS?

Formation Goal: For the students to develop a broader understanding of prayer in its various applications.

During Term 1 the staff had a two- hour meeting led by the Religious Education Adviser in the diocese - Carmen Cassar. Staff learnt about the various forms of prayer including blessings and adoration, prayers of petition, prayers of intercession, prayers of thanksgiving and prayers of praise. Our Christ Centred leaders published two newsletters, which informed parents of the various Religious Education units being studied in each Stage.

<u>Literacy Goal</u>: For all students to improve in their performance in Writing by at least one band in NAPLAN

In all Stages the teachers have commenced daily guided writing groups. The teachers focus on a specific strategy with the students in each group depending on their specific needs. Mrs Mason, Mrs Turner, Mrs Gardoni and I attended a two day course on writing. We were introduced to the Literacy Continuum at this course. The continuum identifies the stages through which students progress in vocabulary knowledge, spelling and grammar, phonics and phonemic awareness. Teachers were able to use our new learning gained at the course to determine where students were on the continuum .

<u>Numeracy Goal</u>: By developing students' ability to interpret questions they will move at least one growth point in EMU and at least one band in NAPLAN.

The teachers have been setting a learning intention and jointly constructing a success criteria at the start of their Numeracy Block every day. In each of the learning spaces there is a mathematics word wall for the students to use as a reference for their learning. Students have continued to explain and prove their thinking in problem solving activities.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

<u>ALL</u> parent volunteers <u>MUST</u> now have a 'Working With Children Check'. This replaces the Prohibited Declaration Forms some parents have completed in the past. These forms are no longer valid. We ask that <u>ALL</u> volunteers complete a 'Working With Children Check' as soon as possible so that you can continue to be a volunteer in our school.

Please go to **www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au** and click on the blue square with the gold star "Start Here" and then follow the prompts. The link for the WWC Check is available on the front page of our website.

The check is free for volunteers and is valid for 5 years.

Parents will need to complete the online application—you will then receive an email with an application number which you will be required to print out and take to the RMS (Roads and Maritime Services) with your identification. Once your application has been processed you will then be sent another email providing you with a 'Working With Children Check' number. Please forward this email to the school email address (stmonicasnparra@parra.catholic.edu.au) where it will be recorded.
