Monica's Matters

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Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Welcome back as we begin Term 3. I hope that your holidays were relaxing and involved some precious family time.

As we are half way through the school year it is an appropriate time to reflect on our goals and what we have achieved in the first semester. The reflections are based on the key beliefs of our school Mission Statement.

We believe that our community must be Christ-centred and authentically Catholic in all its endeavours.

Our students have been exposed to different forms of prayer. The teachers have a focused Religious Education area in their learning space where they have a word wall display that reflects the scriptural readings and the theological background of their Religion unit. The students and teachers are co-creating learning intentions and success criteria of each lesson with the students. Our Christ-centred leaders continue to lead us in prayer and the Religious Education newsletter continues to inform parents of the learning throughout the school, religious and liturgical feasts and outreach initiatives. Opportunities have been provided for Staff to pray and meditate together.

We believe that everyone in our community brings gifts and is appreciated and celebrated.

The children have had opportunities to develop and demonstrate their talents through school assemblies, Talent Quest, Ninja Club, student leadership, library monitors, Dance Fever and the Swimming and Cross Country carnivals.

We believe that quality teaching and learning occurs in an agile space that builds a community of learning.

In the first semester staff continued to use the data from the Mathematical Assessment Interview to guide their teaching. The students were engaged in a challenging numeracy block and used the learning intention and success criteria to monitor their learning. We continued the Year 1 specialist EMU groups and Mrs Weston commenced training so that we can start a Stage 2 specialist group.

In literacy, all teachers have been focused on writing. Four teachers have attended an intensive four day professional learning course. Teachers have had daily focused writing groups and have been tracking students on a literacy continuum that identifies a student's development in vocabulary knowledge, phonological, phonemic awareness and spelling. Reading Recovery continued in Year 1.

Project Based Learning (PBL) continued in Stage 3 and is being introduced in Stage 2. PBL is a teaching method in which students gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to a complex question or problem.

During Term Three and Term Four we will continue our professional learning in Religious Education, Numeracy and Literacy.

Staff Development Day

The staff enjoyed an excellent day of learning during our Staff Development Day on Monday where we further developed our understanding of Project Based Learning. We planned together the Stage 2 PBL Driving Question: 'How can we as historians communicate the impact of British colonisation on Australia and its environment.?" Stage 2 look forward to sharing their product with the school at the end of Term 3. **Staffing News**

Next week Miss Bagnall, Mrs Boulous, Miss Rosewell and I will attend the attend the Project Based Learning Conference in Chicago. Mrs Hanna and Ms Bastawrous will replace Miss Bagnall and Miss Rosewell in their absence.

Mrs Cattermole is making a good recovery and will return to school this term.

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Notice of intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's Primary School.

The Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta has developed a policy related to the notice required from parents to terminate their child/children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this policy states that "A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full terms fees will be paid. The notice can be given anytime during the term for the next term." This means that unless the school receives a term's notice then no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.

Notice in writing will be accepted at anytime during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment. In this circumstance the requirement for 10 week's notice will be waived.

Children's Workbooks coming home on Friday

Next week all teachers will send home the Religious Education book. Each week from then on another workbook will be sent home. We encourage parents to talk to their child about their learning. We encourage you to write a comment after their last piece of work. The children love to receive feedback from you and they also like to know that you are aware of what they are doing at school. You are asked to return the workbook promptly on the following Monday so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book.
