Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Last week Miss Bagnall, Mrs Boulous, Miss Rosewell and I had the pleasure of attending the New Tech Network Project Based Learning (PBL).conference in Chicago. The week-long conference enabled us to connect with over 1,800 representatives from Elementary, Middle and High Schools in America as well as our own colleagues from Marist Westmead, Catherine McAuley, a K – 12 school in Newcastle and a college from Victoria

'Are They Ready?' was the theme of this year's conference encouraging all who attended to be focused on preparing every student for the next phase in their schooling (into primary or secondary, university, TAFE or another career path). Every student needs to be aware, eligible and prepared for their next step in their learning and we as educators need to set about achieving that goal. The goal is indeed a huge one, but it is worthy of our best energy and attention. As educators we need to continue to question how we are responding to our changing world and ensure that 21st century skills are explicitly taught in every learning space at St Monica's.

At the conference we were immersed in a vibrant culture of 'learning to learn' amongst other educators in countless collaborative and learning opportunities, developing a growth mindset through our collective learning.

Last year when St Monica's commenced PBL in our Stage 3 we were encouraged through our partnership with Marist, Westmead to re-imagine teaching and learning. Through our learning we have become increasingly aware of our need to engage all our students and be committed to deepening their learning.

At all our staff meetings this term we will be sharing our new learnings from the conference. We will continue our support of the Stage 2 teachers who have commenced their third project, whilst building all members of staff understanding of the process. We will also commence the induction of our Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two teachers and plan smaller. Exciting times are indeed ahead of us at St Monica's!



Tomorrow Mrs McKenzie and Mrs Weston will take part in a Peer Review that is part of the School Compliance audit process in the diocese. All schools must adhere and align to mandatory compliance areas as specified by the NSW BOSTES registration.

Our teachers will meet with Stage 2 teachers from three other schools in our diocese. The diocese nominates two areas of learning to be reviewed and have nominated Religious Education and Mathematics. The teachers need to take their Term One and Term Two programs to the review as well as all Stage 2 assessments and supporting evidence of their teaching.

Peer Review allows all schools to view, assess and provide critical feedback on the two curriculum areas. The process is an excellent professional learning opportunity and we wish Mrs McKenzie and Mrs Weston well in the process.

We will welcome back Mrs Cattermole next Monday after her leave of absence. I would like to sincerely thank Mrs Carmel Fahy and Mrs Maryanne Grewcock for their dedication and efficiency to the financial position whilst they have been at St Monica's.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO REMOVE A STUDENT FROM ST MONICA'S PRIMARY SCHOOL.

The Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta has developed a policy related to the notice required from parents to terminate their child/children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this policy states that "A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full terms fees will be paid. The notice can be given anytime during the term for the next term." This means that unless the school receives a term's notice then no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.

Notice in writing will be accepted at anytime during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment. In this circumstance the requirement for 10 week's notice will be waived.
