Semester Two Reports

Tomorrow all families will receive their child's Semester Two Report. **Remember to refer to the statements of achievement in your child's report** that describes your child's level of success for each Key Learning Area. In reading your child's report I was very impressed with the effort that the students have made with their learning this semester and the improved work habits. Another highlight was the individual growth of so many students that teachers identified. The students are to be congratulated on their fine efforts.

Parents, when you view your child's report look for strengths first. Focus on strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs. Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort needs attention, then your child has a goal to work towards in 2018. If your child is putting in the required effort, speak to him/her about how pleasing this is and how it has a positive impact on learning. Broaden your focus to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting. How your child interacts with his/her peers will influence their happiness and well-being as well as give an indicator to his/her future.

Discuss the report with your child, talk about strengths first before looking at areas of improvement. Together, share opinions on performance levels and concerns felt.

Student Banking

Next week (Week 10) will be the last week for student banking. Please note that student banking will resume in **Week 3**, Term 1 next year.

School Opal Card

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students need to be NSW residents and may need to live a minimum distance away from their school:

- Years K-2 (Infants) there's no minimum distance.
- Years 3-6 (Primary) 1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking or further.
- Years 7-12 (Secondary) 2.0km straight line distance or 2.9km walking or further.



A School Opal card is provided to eligible students who need to travel within the Opal network. Paper travel passes are issued to eligible students who need to travel outside the Opal network.

Visit **www.opal.com.au** for more information

Step 1: Parents (or students aged 16 and over) complete the online application form

Step 2: The application will be submitted to the school for endorsement.

Step 3: The school will then forward the application to Transport for NSW for processing.

Once approved, Transport for NSW sends the School Opal card to the home address given in the application.

The application may take several weeks. Applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application by email.

Parents with more than one child may select one of the extra teachers available for the interviews if they are unable to co-ordinate times with the stage teachers.



Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states :

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
