Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

This week is National Child Protection Week, a campaign held annually to raise awareness of all issues associated with child protection. One of the main areas of focus is protecting children from sexual exploitation as this should be seen as a whole community responsibility.

Teachers at St Monica's have age appropriate conversations with their students about personal safety and what to do if they find themselves in a situation that makes them feel uncomfortable. Unwanted touching by anyone (family, friends or strangers) is not OK and children have the right to say NO.

In the Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) syllabus the following content is taught in each of our stages:

Early Stage 1:

- identifying a number of possible skills and strategies to stay safe
- recognise that everyone has a right to say yes or no to affection eg hugs, tickles, kisses
- recognise appropriate touch and explore how to respond to inappropriate touch
- practise ways of seeking help in a range of situations eg call 000, use No-Go-Tell when feeling unsafe

Stage 1

- describe situations where they are required to make safe decisions
- describe feelings, reactions and warning signs that can help them recognise safe or unsafe situations eg excitement, feeling anxious, fear
- positive ways to respond to different situations ie.being assertive, seeking help
- recall people they can contact to support themselves and others

Stage 2

- describe how their own and others' skills and strategies contribute to healthy and safe outcomes in a variety of situations
- recognise types of abuse and bullying behaviours and identify safe and supportive upstander behaviour and protective strategies
- Analyse physical and emotional responses that indicate when they and others feel safe or empowered, for example:
- compare feelings they experience in a variety of safe and unsafe situations
- recognise emotional and behavioural warning signs associated with unsafe situations eg secrets, bribes, threats, negative feelings, power and control

Stage 3

- examine the influence of emotional responses on behaviour and relationships
- explore scenarios to identify behaviours which makes a scenario safe or unsafe eg warning signs, secrets, threats, bribes, violence
- practise skills to establish and manage relationships, for example:
- recognise risk, abuse and neglect in relationships and ways to seek help
- select and practise appropriate ways to resolve conflict and deal with coercion, abuse and violence, eg negotiation, refusal skills

When a child is abused, the physical and mental pain can last a lifetime. Sadly, according to the National Association for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (NAPCAN) over 35,000 Australian children were abused last year.

Technology has given our children new opportunities for social interactions, and most importantly, more ways to learn about the world and express themselves. However, there are also challenges faced by our children online that we need to talk to them about. These include online grooming, cyber bullying, online reputation management and sharing of images. By educating and empowering our children to be safe, respectful and resilient online, we can help minimise the risk of things going wrong online.

The best way to understand what your children are doing online is to ASK them about what they are SEEING, SAYING and DOING online.

Peer Review

Yesterday our Stage 3 teachers, Mrs Angela Wedesweiler and Mrs Emily Harrison, participated in a Peer Review.

In our Diocese every school takes part in a Peer Review once a year. Schools receive a notification three weeks before review and then one week before, the school is notified of the Stage and the two areas of learning.

Stage 3 had to present their English and Mathematics programs to representatives from three other schools to determine whether we were compliant as specified by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) in each of the two key

learning areas.

Emily and Angela had 60 minutes each to present their curriculum documentation, assessment plans, student records of achievement and student work samples demonstrating differentiation of learning tasks. Both teachers were affirmed of their practice, highlighting the exceptional work being carried out in our school, meeting the needs of our students in all areas of their learning.

Thank you to Miss Rebecca Boidin who assisted both teachers in the lead up to the review and on the day.

As Principal I was also required to present documentation to support that we were compliant in certain areas including Attendance Data and Management Plans,

Pastoral Care Policy, Mandatory Reporting and School Procedures, Critical

Incident Management and evidence of Evacuation and Lockdown Drills, Medication Policy and Teacher Accreditation.



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
