Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

On Monday as our nation celebrated ANZAC Day we were reminded of the men and women who were prepared to make sacrifices, many giving their lives, for the freedom and quality of life that we enjoy today. These men and women were of great character acting with resilience, selflessness and perseverance. They made the huge commitment to serve their country and they got on with the job with energy and initiative.

Teaching our children the value of commitment is a huge responsibility and requires us to teach by example. Through our own actions we must show them what commitment looks like, and we must purposely give them opportunities to demonstrate it in their own lives.

In the school setting each day I have experienced the commitment of the teachers to the achievement of their students. Commitment is an essential element of successful teaching—cultivating students' curiosity and interest in learning. In addition to your other responsibilities as parents you remain continuously committed to working in partnership with us in the education of your children.

A few years ago Andrew Mullins wrote a book 'Parenting for Character'. He urged readers to "Teach your children to honour commitments, to keep their word, to face up to consequences of the simplest actions, otherwise, when commitments become adult sized, their good intentions may not last the distance. If they lack the necessary habit of commitment, intentions can unravel when life picks away at them."

Being able to honour commitments has a lot to do with having a good strong character and 'good character' in our children does not just happen; it is the outcome of consistent efforts of parents and teachers over many years. Aristotle made the observation that, "Good moral behaviour comes about as the result of habit, we become just by doing just acts, brave by doing brave acts." We are not born with character. Character is a learned behavior.

Psychologist, Tom Likona, suggests that character can be understood better if taken in two parts: 'Performance Character - those qualities such as self-discipline and perseverance that enables us to give our best effort and do our best work in any performance context and Moral Character - those qualities such as honesty, justice and caring that enables us to have successful relationships, live and work in community and assume the responsibility of citizenship." He goes on to say that, "The goal of Catholic character is not simply 'good character' but the character of Christ."

When we encourage our children to be the best possible persons they can be, we are encouraging them to strive for excellence, to develop their gifts, those talents that enable them to become fully the person God means them to be. When we encourage our children to be of strong moral character, we are asking them to exercise the capacity God gave them for goodness and the ability to love other people in a way that reflects God's love - to be of the character of Christ.

By providing loving relationships, being good role models, setting high expectations, upholding firm and fair discipline and by holding our children accountable to themselves, we provide an environment that supports the development of good character; we provide the means for our children to grow as people committed to the Christian way.

Kindergarten 2017 interviews

This week Father Fernando and I have commenced meeting with new families seeking to enrol their children at St Monica's next year. It is always an immense privilege to listen to the aspirations and dreams that parents have for their children and their motivation in seeking to join this Catholic community.

Often what are put forward as reasons for seeking a Catholic-based education is described in terms such as: nurturing, community, faith, values, high expectations, holistic and broad education, care, support, committed teachers, family and relationships.

What is often being described in this language is not simply words but a reality to be lived. This reality is based on children being educated as part of a community where Christ is encountered each day through kindness, forgiveness, love, patience, hospitality, compassion and service.

NAPLAN

In 12 days time the students in Year 3 and Year 5 will sit the NAPLAN test. This testing is an Australia wide test completed under set conditions to ensure reliable, nationally comparable results across all schools and sectors. They are 'a snapshot' of a student at one point of time in his/her learning.

Many factors can influence a student's performance on the day such as illness, a family crisis, lack of sleep and anxiety issue.

Therefore, it would be wrong to define a student's capability and capacity as a learner by a 'one test on a day'. A student's overall performance can not be measured by any one NAPLAN result.

Student growth is a daily, life-long journey. As with all journeys, sometimes the road is long and hard, winding and unpredictable, fun and challenging and full of surprises along the way. Parts of the journey are smooth sailing, parts are difficult, other parts are easy and happy But the journey is life-long.

At St Monica's our teachers have ongoing data on every student and they use these to inform their teaching and learning on a daily basis. Intervention is designed and personalised learning plans are established as we gather more data and make observations. The work that teachers do every day is enormous.

When NAPLAN results are received at the end of Term 3 our school will use the information as a guide to measure the effectiveness of our teaching in literacy and numeracy.

Once again we supply breakfast each morning for the Year 3 and Year 5 children who are completing NAPLAN. The breakfast will be held in the Hall commencing at 8:00am. Cereal, toast and fruit will be served. If any parent can assist serving breakfast please contact Bernadette Haddad 0409 507 059.





ALL parent volunteers MUST now have a 'Working with Children Check'.

This replaces the Prohibited Declaration Forms some parents have completed in the past. These forms are no longer valid.

We ask that <u>ALL</u> volunteers complete a 'Working With Children Check' as soon as possible so that you can continue to be a volunteer in our school. This includes volunteering in the classroom and on excursions.

Please go to **www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au** and click on the blue square with the gold star "Start Here" and then follow the prompts. The link for the WWC Check is available on the front page of our website.

The check is free for volunteers and is valid for 5 years.

Parents will need to complete the online application—you will then receive an email with an application number.

- Print out this email and take it to the RMS (Roads and Maritime Services) with your identification.
- Once your application has been processed you will then be sent another email providing you with a
 'Working With Children Check' number. Please forward this email to the school email address stmonicasnparra@parra.catholic.edu.au (please include your date of birth).
