Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

This Sunday we will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost and twenty-three of our young parishioners will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. This is a significant occasion not only for the children, their sponsors and their families, but for all of us as it offers us an opportunity to again reflect on what this call to discipleship means today.

Pentecost commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit whom God sent to empower us to love one another, and to be witnesses to our faith.

We know and believe that God calls us to live a life of love, that in living this way we are called to live a spiritual life, not by denying ourselves but by reaching out to others. The spiritual life is not a matter of not doing wrong to another; rather a truly spiritual life depends on our doing good for others.

The celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation in our parish this Sunday provides us again with a 'reminder' of the real meaning of life. The liturgy's rituals and symbols enables one's heart to stop for a moment, to be reminded of the 'why' of the ordinariness of our everyday for it is here that we are called to be disciples of Christ. Not in Africa, not even working for the underprivileged. It is in the unexpected moments in our day to day life that God does and will come to life in us.

Discipleship is a call to respond to God who is with and in us, unconditionally, in privacy and in crowds, in the chaos of our worlds, who loves us and calls us to reach out in love. (adapted from Intentional Disciples Sherry A. Weddell)

Every few years the Bishop or his elected representative spends two days in the Parish. Father Peter will visit each of the learning spaces and will speak to staff regarding the Religious Education programme at St Monica's.

Semester One Reports/Parent Teacher Interviews

On Monday all students were given a copy of the times when their teacher/s will be available for Parent/Teacher Interviews. Please return the slip promptly to secure a mutually agreed interview time. Every effort is made to give parents their nominated time and the teachers make every effort to coordinate sibling interview times.

The teachers have been working hard preparing the Semester One Reports for your children. With the term being only nine weeks this has been a little problematic in ensuring that the assessments and grades reflect as much of the Term 2 learning that is possible.

It is important to remember here at St Monica's that our expectations for your children are high. This means to attain an A or B grade the children must meet criteria that indicates that they have a high level of understanding and accomplishment. Most research on children's learning indicates that great schools have high expectations for their students. At St Monica's we will continue to honour the expectations of the E to A reporting scale to ensure that our standards and expectations for your children remain high.

MAKING SENSE OF YOUR CHILD'S REPORT

The reporting format is reflective of the Board of Studies Common Grade Scale. The E-A grading scale is from Year 1- Year 6 only. Kindergarten students will receive a report, showing achievement against a criterion which is more appropriate at this stage of their development.

The Year 1-6 report indicates the extent to which the student demonstrates **Knowledge** and **Skills** not **Work Habits** and **Attitudes.**

A 'C' grade will indicate that your child is progressing at a grade appropriate level and is to be congratulated on their achievements in Semester 1.

COMMON GRADE SCALE

 \mathbf{E}

A student awarded an E grade has **elementary knowledge** and understanding in a few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills. The student requires assistance by a teacher to complete the task

D

A student awarded a 'D' grade has **basic knowledge and understanding** of the content and has achieved a limited level of achievement. The student requires some additional assistance to complete tasks.

C

The most common grade is the 'C' grade. A C grade indicates that the student is achieving at the expected grade level and to their capabilities. A student awarded a 'C' grade has sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved a satisfactory level of competence in the processes and skills. The student is working at grade level, meeting expectations for the grade, producing quality work samples.

B

A student awarded a 'B' grade has a **thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and skills.** The student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations. The student is working above grade level, is very capable, above average and is exceeding school benchmarks/expectations for their grade level.

A

A student awarded an 'A' grade has an **extensive knowledge and understanding** of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. The student is achieving <u>well beyond grade level</u>, uses complex language structures, higher order thinking skills, applies skills to new situations, applies knowledge- makes connections, possesses a wide variety of strategies and internalises concepts.

Special thanks to all the teachers for the professional way they have prepared the children's reports and for the preparation that they are currently doing for the interviews. They work extremely hard for your children and from the work that I am seeing and the conversations that I am having with the students your children are definitely benefitting from it.

Road safety around your child's school Your child's safety depends on you



Drop off and pick up by car

- Make sure your children are in an appropriate child car seat that is fitted and used correctly.
- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone as children are about.
- Look for buses pulling out watch for flashing wig wag lights.
- Always park and turn legally around schools.
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop off and pick up area. Calling out to them from across the road is dangerous they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car on the kerb side of the road to be away from passing traffic.

Walking together to and from school

- Plan your trip to school so you use pedestrian crossings where possible.
- Always hold your child's hand. Children need your help to spot dangers such as vehicles coming out of driveways. They can also be easily distracted and wander into traffic.
- Drop off and pick up your child near the school gate and avoid calling them from across the road.
- Talk with your children about Stop, Look, Listen and Think every time they cross the road.
- STOP! one step back from the kerb.
- LOOK! for traffic to your right, left and right again.
- LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic.
- THINK! whether it is safe to cross.
- Young children can learn these safe pedestrian habits from you and continue them later on when they are old enough to travel alone.
