Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

We are over the halfway point of term and the teachers have been working hard on our identified school goals each week at our staff meeting.

Our goals have one clear core intention and that is to improve the learning outcomes for all our students. To successfully achieve our goals in 2014 we need to build the capacity of our teachers and our students. This year the staff have identified three goals that focus on the areas of Formation, Literacy and Numeracy.

- **Formation**: In 2014 the students and teachers will continue to deepen their understanding of scripture and they will explore the different names for God. During the year scripture and key concepts will be displayed in each learning space.
- Literacy- Our goal is to improve the student performance in Reading and Writing by gathering, analysing and responding to student data. During the year the teachers will bring student work samples to staff meetings for analysis and they will then plan future learning for the student. Small guided writing groups will be established in every learning space. The teachers will be engaging their students in writing strategies for text and sentence structures, spelling and punctuation.
- Numeracy- In 2014 the teachers will focus on using and explicitly explaining mathematical language. The students will be encouraged to use appropriate mathematical language when they reflect on the strategies that they have used in their daily problem solving activity. A mathematical word wall will be very visible in each learning space for the students to refer to especially at reflection time. The learning intention and success criteria will continue to be clearly displayed for each numeracy block.

Student Workbooks

Last Friday the students in Year 1 – Year 6 received two of their workbooks to share with their family over the weekend.

Lots of children were excited on Monday to share their parent's written feedback with their peers and teachers. This feedback to your child is a constant reminder that you are interested in their learning and care about the standard of work that they are producing.

Over the next consecutive Fridays two more workbooks will be sent home each week.

Please ensure that your child's workbooks are returned each Monday so that your child can continue their written work in their book.

I would appreciate any feedback from parents on this new initiative that will continue throughout the year.

Extended Absences/Student Leave for Reasons Other Than Illness

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason other than illness or a school related event you are required for an exemption in writing with a full explanation of the reason for leave which will then be processed by the principal and an approved exemption will be supplied to you. An *Application for Exemption for Attendance* is available on the school website and also through the school office.

If the absence from school is longer than 20 days a copy of travel documents will need to be supplied to support the request for exemption. If an absence from school is longer than 100 school days then the request will need to be

supported by an explanation and a copy of relevant travel documents. This application will be processed by the Principal and forwarded to the Catholic Education Office. A copy of the Guidelines for Exemption for attendance at NSW Catholic Systemic Schools' in its entirety is available on request from the school office.

OUALITY CATHOLIC SCHOOLING PROJECT

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta will once again be participating in the Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) project in 2014.

QCS will provide data from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community and will assist us to focus our efforts for improvement by building on our successes to date.

From **Monday 7th March to Monday 31st March** all staff, all students from Stage 3 and 60 randomly selected parents by the Catholic Education Office will be asked to complete an online survey. Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents will be sent home a paper survey but will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred. The survey will take about 20 – 30 minutes to complete. If you choose to complete the survey online, we ask that you send a short email to the school notifying us that the survey has been completed.

A survey consultant (Insight SRC) has been engaged to manage the data collection. The survey data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual will be identified to the school or the Catholic Education Office. Each school will receive an information report at the end of may and will use this report to inform their planning.

Any parent selected to complete the survey is encouraged to participate as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas which we can focus our improvement.

2015 KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS

St Monica's Primary School is now accepting enrolments for Kindergarten (Early Stage One). Enrolment Application forms may be collected from the school office or you may download an enrolment form from the School Website (www.stmonicasparra.catholic.edu.au) then go to the PARENTS heading, then click on Enrolments.

When lodging your application you will need to provide your child's **original birth and baptismal certificates and an up-to-date immunisation form.** A \$30 non-refundable Enrolment Application Fee will need to be returned with your completed application.

When lodging your Enrolment form you will be given an interview time - your child will need to attend this meeting with you. **Enrolment interviews will take place during Term 2.**

The closing date for Kindergarten 2015 enrolments is Friday 11 April 2014 (last day of Term 1)

SKOOLBAG APP (FREE app)

STUDENT BANKING

Students will notice that the yellow checklist has been removed from their deposit wallet (as advised by the Bank) to create less confusion when redeeming rewards.

As previously advised, **Student Banking has now been upgraded and changes have been implemented with regards to the rewards system**. As the change-over has now occurred **students will be notified via their deposit wallet when they are eligible to redeem their reward**. Deposits have been recalculated by the bank and may vary from your own calculations.
















Catherine McAuley—Reunion
