Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Prepare Your Child for NAPLAN

You have probably heard a number of various viewpoints expressed in the media with regards to the NAPLAN tests. These words from Michael Grose will hopefully be of benefit when considering the NAPLAN tests.

"One view commonly put forward is that the NAPLAN tests put undue pressure on children to perform in test situations. If so, then perhaps the best approach for parents and teachers is to help them handle the pressure rather than avoid it. The most resilient children and young people are those who rise to meet rather than retreat from the challenges presented to them."

Perhaps the best way is to view the NAPLAN tests as good learning experiences rather than dreaded pressure tests.

Children and young people take their cues from their parents about how to handle many situations. Optimistic parents beget optimistic kids, just as anxious parents can beget anxious kids.

As a parent, it helps your child if you take a positive view of the NAPLAN tests. It's better to see them as learning opportunities for kids as well as opportunities for them to overcome any anxieties or nerves that these tests may bring on.

It's also worth remembering that many children don't stress over these tests. The vast majority take them in their stride, wondering what all the fuss is about.

Whether or not your child takes them in his/her stride, here are some tips to help prepare your child for the NAPLAN tests:

- 1. Take your cues from your child. If your child doesn't worry about them then neither should you. Be careful not to create a problem that doesn't exist by incessantly talking about, or worse, worrying about the test.
- 2. Focus on your child doing his/her best and trying hard. Choose your words carefully when you speak with your children. As with all their learning activities, place your focus squarely on effort rather than results. The only pressure on kids should be to try hard rather than to do well.
- 3. Listen to any concerns they have: If your child confesses to some nerves then validate their feelings. Rather than shut them down with a 'get over it' response. "Yes sometimes tests can be a little bit scary, but they get easier every time that you take them." Use this as an opportunity to develop some emotional smarts, which starts with recognising how kids feel.
- 4. Give them some relaxation ideas. Anxious or nervous people will benefit from some simple relaxation strategies. Taking some deep breaths, changing their thinking and exercising on the morning of the test are simple ways to help them get some feeling of control

Each morning of NAPLAN we will be providing breakfast for the Year 3 and Year 5 students in the hall. Breakfast commences at 8:15am and will conclude at 8:45am.

CATCHING TEACHERS ON THE HOP

Throughout the year you are always welcome to come and discuss your child's learning progress with his/her teacher. We do ask, however, that you make an appointment by phone or letter so that you are able to discuss any issues in a relaxed manner at a mutually convenient time.

Parents are kindly requested not to seek interviews with the teacher during class time, morning assembly or whilst the teacher is on playground duty. This also includes catching the teacher to quickly let them know things about your children eg they didn't do their homework or they are not feeling well.

If you need to talk briefly to the teacher before school please go to the office prior to 8:50am and the ladies in the office will locate the teacher so that you can talk to them.

BUS RULES FOR A SAFE TRIP HOME

In the morning and afternoon the students at St Monica's need to follow some simple guidelines to ensure a safe trip to and from school.

- 1. At all times students are to remain seated whilst the bus is moving and keep their voices at an 'inside' level to allow the driver to concentrate on his or her job of driving the bus.
- 2. In the afternoon the students wait quietly on the bus lines outside the hall for the duty teacher. They then proceed with the teacher to wait at the bus stops on Church Street.
- 3. The students are asked to have their bus pass ready for the driver
- 4. Obey the bus rules and do not eat or drink on the bus.

Parents of children catching the bus are encouraged to talk to their child about these guidelines. Any problems encountered on the bus should be reported to the school so that we can follow up the matter.






