Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Last Wednesday Mrs Mason, Mrs Turner, Mrs Gardoni and I attended our third professional learning day on Writing to support our school goal this year. Part of the day was building teacher knowledge about oral language as this is critical for the student's development in their literacy skills. It is through talk in the first instance that oral vocabulary is built; the ability to process and produce complex sentences is first practiced through speaking and our skills in recalling, narrating and persuading are first done through talk.

Oral language has a major social function as it is an important way that we connect with other people, build relationships and share our thoughts and feelings. At its most basic level, oral language is about communicating with other people. It involves a process of organising our thoughts, imparting knowledge coherently and using effective speaking and listening skills.

Oral language permeates every facet of the primary school curriculum. The development of oral language is as important as reading and writing, at every level, in the curriculum. Teachers focus on activities based on purposeful language interactions. Purposeful talk prior to writing is one of the major means through which children construct and refine their understanding of language. Effective communication builds confidence and self esteem.

Research clearly shows that it is through their everyday experiences that children gain the oral language skills they need to become strong writers and readers. It is essential that children are exposed to an abundance of language in their everyday lives both at school and at home.

The Australian Literacy Educators' Association offers the following suggestions to support your child's oral language development:

- model a rich vocabulary
- engage in lively conversations
- provide the time and place for imaginative play
- encourage your child to talk about their thinking
- praise turn taking and active listening
- talk about the great books that you read together
- wonder together about the world
- use open-ended questions when asking your child about their day eg.
 - Tell me something that made you laugh today.
 - Tell me three different times that you used your pen/pencil today?
 - What challenged you today?
 - What was a new word/weird word that you heard today?
 - How did you help someone today? How did someone help you today?
 - What was your favourite part at lunch time today?
 - What three words do you think your teacher would say about you today?
