Do I readily say, "I'm sorry?"


Do I utilize the power of smiles, warm expressions, and direct eye contact?

Do I show empathy? Can I walk in the shoes of another?




This fortnight I would like to share with you some of the teaching and learning that occurs in our classrooms every day for Literacy. In all our learning spaces the students are engaged in purposeful writing tasks assisted by their teachers who provide support for them through explicit teaching. Teachers guide students by demonstrating how to achieve particular purposes, discussing the effectiveness of writers' choices and giving feedback at all stages of the writing process. The ultimate goal of all teaching is for students to become independent writers.



Bullying- NO WAY!

It doesn't matter whether it's physical, psychological or even cyber. Bullying is a concern that our school takes very seriously and is constantly working on to address.

A student is bullied or victimised when he or she is exposed repeatedly and over time, to negative actions on the part of one or more other students.

Bullying is characterised by three criteria:

- 1. It is aggressive behaviour or intentional "harm doing."
- 2. It is carried out repeatedly and over time; and
- 3. It occurs within an interpersonal relationship characterised by an imbalance of power.

If you suspect your child is being bullied, you should talk with your child and make an appointment with the teacher or myself to discuss your concerns. It is also important to encourage your child to report bullying behaviours to a trusted adult at school as quickly as possible after an incident of bullying. Bullying thrives in a culture of secrecy, so telling the school is important.

Some signs of bullying might include:

- Loss of confidence
- Changes in eating or sleeping habits, possible bedwetting
- Health problems such as headaches or stomach aches
- Unhappiness or mood swings with sudden temper tantrums
- Reluctance to go to school and changes in academic performance.

What you can do:

- Talk with your child and keep the lines of communication open so children are more likely to confide in you.
- Encourage your child to feel okay to ask others for help and to keep their own safety in mind.
- Ensure your child knows how to report bullying and to ask for help when needed
- Report the incident to a teacher. Don't try to sort out the situation yourself.
- Make sure you are modelling healthy behaviours to your child, especially in relation to conflict resolution and anger management.
- Help protect your child from harassment and cyber-bullying by closely monitoring internet use and installing free internet filters.

Procedural Fairness

Procedural fairness is a basic right of all when dealing with authorities. Procedural fairness refers to what are sometimes described as the 'hearing rule' and the 'right to an unbiased decision'. It forms the basis of our Student Management Policy. All teachers follow the principles of the 'hearing rule' and the 'right to an unbiased decision' when classroom and playground issues are brought to their attention.

The 'hearing rule' includes the right of the person against whom an allegation has been made to:

- Know the allegation related to a specific matter and any other information which will be taken into
 account in considering the matter.
- Know the process by which the process will be considered.
- Respond to the allegations.
- Know how to seek a review of the decision made in response to the allegations.

Our practices and procedures contribute to creating an environment where each person feels valued and respected and develops a sense of self-worth and achievement. These include positive strategies to ensure that all forms of discrimination, harassment, bullying or racism will not occur as they are considered to be unacceptable in our school; because such attitudes do not support our belief in the dignity of each person. We work in partnership with parents to ensure all matters are dealt with fairly and in a timely manner. A copy of our Complaints Handling Policy is on the website and a hard copy is available in the School Office foyer.

School Uniform

I have been approached by some parents over the past few years to look into an alternate type of shirt for the school uniform that would be worn all year round. I have approached our school supplier, Oz Fashions Australia, and they have designed these two shirts. As you can see from the photograph there would be a boy and a girl's shirt (unlike the unisex shirt we have at present).

The shirts are polyester cotton and the care instructions indicatehand wash or a gentle machine wash with similar colours. Do not bleach or soak and rinse well. Dry without delay away from direct heat and do not tumble dry. Shirt requires a warm iron.

Girl's shirt \$34 inclusive of GST Boy's shirt \$32 inclusive of GST

The shirts will be displayed on the fence near kiss and drop each morning and will be on display in the afternoon pick up area for parents to have a closer look at the garments.

Every family will receive a voting form next Thursday, 10 March, so that we know the opinions of all.

If the new designs are successful after the votes are counted then there will be a 2 year changeover into the new shirts. Stage 3 in 2017 would not be required to wear the new uniform but Kindergarten 2017 and any new student to the school would be required to wear the uniform from January 2017.

Additionally, we ask that the books be returned each Monday so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book.

School Evacuation

In the last newsletter I informed parents that we had successfully practised our school evacuation. We have always had the grass area in front of St Monica's Church as our assembly area for these drills.

This year we would like to practise the child assembling in an alternative area outside the school. For the purpose of this exercise we will evacuate the students into Daking Street. Over the next few days the teachers and students will rehearse their alternate exit from the school. At this stage Early Stage One, Year 1 and Stage 2 (Mr Tyszkiewicz) will exit via the Community Room, Year 2 and Stage 2 (Miss Rosewell) will exit via the Teacher's Workroom and Stage 3 and Stage 2 (Mrs Gardoni) via the gate on Daking Street. We will then have an official evacuation drill with all classes vacating the school into Daking Street.

It is always difficult at the beginning of the new school year with dismissal in the afternoons. I would ask parents, carers and relatives collecting students to remember the importance of safety. Your children are precious and it is important that everyone is able to enter and leave the school grounds safely. **Please remember that entry into the school grounds is only via Daking Street**. There is provision for two lanes entering the grounds. I have had reports from parents wishing to park and walk in to collect their child that they are prevented in doing so because a driver is occupying the two lanes at the school entry. 
The evening will also include a 3D astronomy movie, a tour of the dome area and an opportunity to view the night sky through the observatory's telescopes.

6 Simple and effective strategies

- Teach them the value of education
- Encourage a growth mindset

- Be mindful of what you say and do
- Take attendance seriously

Daily punctuality is important. The early part of each day is critical.

Important learning is scheduled during this time – when children are rested and receptive.

Key concepts are built in this time.

We all need to work together with our children's best interest in mind to ensure that students are at school every day and that they are well enough to attend.

Lead learning in the home:

- Talk to your child
- Read to your child
- Make the most of any teachable moment that comes along in the home
- Let them have a go at things even if you could do it better, faster, neater

Reading your child's report

- Look for strengths first
- Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning
- Broaden your focus and form a picture of your child's progress
- Discuss the report. Ask for their opinion about how they performed

Tips to Prepare Child For High School:

- Be positive and enthusiastic
- Attend orientation events
- Find a school buddy for your child
- Understand the school routine
- Be prepared ahead of time
- Visit the school
- Figure out a travel route
- Practice travelling to and from school
- Have an emergency safety plan
- Encourage your child to talk about their feelings
- Connect with the child
