Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Last week we celebrated Catholic Schools Week - a week where our school was able to celebrate what makes our school such a special place for our students to learn and grow in faith. St Monica's has a supportive community of teachers, support staff, parents, carers, clergy and parishioners who all work together to focus on giving students the best possible education in the Catholic tradition.

The students, staff and our community are always striving to make our school a place of acceptance, of learning and of care and compassion for others.

During Catholic Schools Week we conducted a number of activities. On Tuesday we held our Cross Country trials for our primary students and then invited the school community to visit our learning spaces and view the students actively engaged in their learning.

On Wednesday we welcomed 30 prospective families who attended our open day. We had a number of tours during the morning that were ably conducted by eight of our Year 6 students - Jackson, Patrick, Brooke, Philip, Natasha, Brendan, Lachlan and Jack. I was very proud of each of them. These students confidently answered questions, spoke about the learning in every learning space and spoke highly of the great things that take place every day in our school. At the conclusion of each of the tours the visitors spoke highly of these students' communication skills and their level of maturity, especially talking about what it means to be a 21st century learner. Thank you to Tiff Cooper who also showed our visitors around our school and answered questions.



During the week our school hosted 20 educators from St Bernadette's Dundas Valley, St Mary's Rydalmere and St Patrick's Parramatta, as well as three leading curriculum educators from the Catholic Education Office. Each school shared their current Religious Education, Literacy and Numeracy data aligned to their individual school goals. During the meeting our school leadership team shared the analysis of our Religious Literacy, Writing and Mathematical Assessment Interview data and the strategies that we have adopted so far to support our teachers and student learning. Our colleagues affirmed us in the work that we have already undertaken and offered the school leadership team suggestions for future direction.

Finally, on Friday we concluded our celebration of Catholic Schools Week with our whole School Mass. Thank you to our Stage 3 students, Mrs Paley and Miss Bagnall who prepared our beautiful Mass.

Kindergarten 2017

We are currently accepting enrolment applications for Kindergarten 2017. Please let family, friends and neighbours know that they can download the enrolment application form from our school website or collect one from our school office.

Last year the Parramatta Diocese revised the Enrolment Policy for all of their schools. The policy offers Catholic families a greater choice by allowing them to enrol in any school in the Parramatta Diocese.

Our enrolments officially opened on Wednesday 9 March and will close on Monday 4 April 2016. First Round interviews with Miss O'Donnell and Father Fernando will commence at the end of April (Term 2).

Where places are limited, priority will be given in the following order:

- * Catholic children who live in the local parish
- * Catholic children from other parishes
- * Children of families who actively participate in the life of the school and local parish community (eg siblings)
- * Orthodox children
- * Children from other Christian faiths
- * Children of non-Christian faith.

Quality Catholic Schools Survey

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta will once again be participating in the Quality Catholic Schooling Survey (QCS). The QCS survey provides information from students, staff and parents about our school’s cultural behavior, relationships and learning community, and assists us in our focus on continuous improvement.

Between 21 March and 1 April all Staff, Year 3-6 students and 60 randomly selected families selected by the Catholic Education Office Parramatta will be asked to complete an online survey. Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents who have been randomly selected will be sent home a paper survey but they will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred. The survey will take about 20 – 30 minutes to complete. The survey provides data about our school’s cultural behavior, relationships and learning community.

This year we will need to include a student identifier in the student survey. The survey will still remain confidential and individual responses will not be accessible by the school or the Catholic Education Office. An independent survey consultant (Insight SRC) who manages the data collection will ensure the survey data is kept strictly confidential.

Each school will receive a de-identified information report at the end of May to help us to develop strategies for further improvement. This will definitely assist the school in working with all students to further improve their learning.

Parents who have been randomly selected to complete the survey are encouraged to participate as this will help our school to identify our strengths and the areas in which we can focus our improvement. Please contact Mrs Abood if you have any operational or procedural questions.

Numeracy Goal: For all students to improve in multiplication and division by at least one growth point.

Mathematics is important at St Monica’s! All students participate in a one-hour lesson every day. This includes a warm up activity, exploration of an open ended task and a reflection time. Displays in each of the learning spaces reflect the learning taking place in each of the spaces. Ask your child to tell you about their Mathematics lesson today!

GRIP LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE 2016

On March 7th, six students arrived at school at 8.00am and were ready for a day full of leadership learning. As they walked down the stairs of the Homebush Sport Centre to the basketball court set up for the conference, and took a peek at the notebooks provided, they knew that they were in for a fabulous day!

We started off with a key message not to be forgotten: The overall goal requires my contribution, and different peoples' contribution is needed at different times. In short, this means we are all good at different things and we all must work together.

A person doesn't become a leader by being chosen, they become a leader by continually growing. The first session was all about growing as a leader, and the speakers used the metaphor of a tree. The roots being what we believe are the CORE VALUES, the trunk symbolizes COMBINING WITH OTHERS, not only one person leading, but many to create a great range of uniqueness and individuality. The leaves and branches tell us to CONTRIBUTE TO WHAT IS AROUND YOU. As leaders we must be willing to assist when we are asked and know when to be responsible when we are not. The last part of the tree is the water. The water makes the tree grow, the tree being the leaders, and the water being what we are taught about leadership. It symbolizes CONSTANT INPUT, because you never stop learning how to be a leader. The quote we were told for this topic was "It is not enough to just know what leadership is, we must grow in leadership and show leadership."

Parking and traffic rules in school zones



You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. **Please choose safety over convenience.**



	You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a max. of two minutes to drop off and pick up passengers. If no spaces are available you cannot queue on the road way or in any other zones while waiting for a space. You will need to drive away and park elsewhere, only returning when there is space to pull up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times and cannot leave your vehicle unattended.	Provides a safe place for children / pedestrian set down and pick up.	EXCEEDS \$177 	(School Zone) 2 
	You must not stop or park in a BUS ZONE for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space) unless you are driving a bus. If times are shown on the sign, you are not allowed to stop during those times.	Provides a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.	EXCEEDS \$319 	(School Zone) 2

Demerit Points:

* The **Demerit Points** Scheme is a national program that allocates penalty points (demerits) for a range of driving offences. A driver who has not committed any offences has 'zero' points. If you commit an offence that carries demerit points, the points are added to your driving record. If you incur the threshold number of demerit points within a three-year period, a licence suspension or refusal is applied. The three-year period is calculated between the dates the offences were committed. It ends on the day your most recent offence was committed.
