Sonara worked relentlessly for years to ensure that Father's Day became a reality and in 1924 President Calvin Coolidge recognised the first Father's Day.

Procedural Fairness

Procedural fairness is a basic right of all when dealing with authorities. Procedural fairness refers to what is sometimes described as the 'hearing rule' and the 'right to an unbiased decision'. It forms the basis of our Student Management Policy. All teachers follow the principles of the 'hearing rule' and the 'right to an unbiased decision' when classroom and playground issues are brought to their attention.

The 'hearing rule' includes the right of the person against whom an allegation has been made to:

- Know the allegation related to a specific matter and any other information which will be taken into account in considering the matter.
- Know the process by which the process will be considered.
- Respond to the allegations.
- Know how to seek a review of the decision made in response to the allegations.

Our practices and procedures contribute to creating an environment where each person feels valued, respected and develops a sense of self-worth and achievement. These include positive strategies to ensure that all forms of discrimination, harassment, bullying or racism are deemed unacceptable because such belief dignity attitudes do support our in the of each partnership with parents to ensure all matters are dealt with fairly and in a timely manner. Technology at School

Dear Parents,

We are starting to notice that some students are not always appropriately using technology at school, which is disappointing.

At the beginning of the year every student (and their parent) signed a Letter of Agreement form, which states that students have read and understood the rules and responsibilities of the schools Acceptable Use Policy. Every time students log on to a device at school they have to agree to the "Acceptable User Policy" terms again.



At school Stage 2 and Stage 3 students use their school email addresses for schoolwork only. They share and send work within their classes, as well as teachers sending them resources and work, including their homework. This email address is **not to be used for personal use outside of school**, only school related learning.

Any students who are not using technology appropriately during learning time, will be excluded from using technology for a time determined by the Principal and parents will be contacted.
