Early Stage One

Unit #1: A Community that celebrates God's Love

Students will *identify* times when they join with their Church family to celebrate, *locate* and *explain* the use or purpose of key features of the parish church, *describe* some of the key tasks involved in the ministry of the parish priest(s) and *list* some of the major ways in which parishioners serve and support others in the parish.

Stage 1

Unit #1: Baptism

Students will *discuss* some of the ways in which children are welcomed into and shown that they belong to families and groups such as sporting teams and youth organisations, *explain* the meaning of Baptism as a special celebration where we are welcomed into God's family, *compare* and *contrast* the story of the Baptism of Jesus with accounts of their own Baptism, *name* key rituals and symbols associated with Baptism and *describe* ways they can help other people feel special and that they belong.

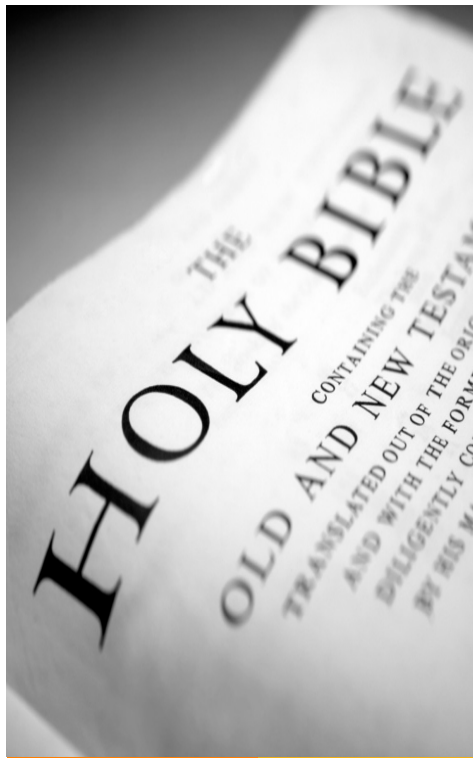
Unit #2: Senses: A Gift from God

Students will *appreciate* that their senses are a gift from God, *express* using a variety of mediums, thankfulness to God for the many gifts we experience through our senses, *retell* a Scripture story which tells how Jesus healed others and *participate* in a liturgy which involves use of all the senses.

Stage 2

Unit #1: Caring for God's Wondrous Creation (Year 3)

Students will *recognise* and *appreciate* the beauty and wonder of God's creation, *grow* in awareness of the need to care and take responsibility for God's creation and *compose* psalms of praise in which they celebrate and give thanks for God's creation.



Unit #1: God's Forgiveness and Healing (Year 4) - RLA

Students will *appreciate* that sometimes in relationships there is hurt which requires healing and forgiveness, *retell* stories of forgiveness and healing in the New Testament, *explain* and *relate* to their own lives The Parable of the Forgiving Father and *recall* the ways in which the Church helps them to forgive and to be forgiven, and gives , peace and courage to those who are ill, suffering or frail through old age.

Unit #2: Mary: A Woman of Faith

Students will *recall* the key events in the life of Mary, the mother of Jesus, *identify* how Mary listened and responded to God's call throughout her life, *express* an understanding of Mary as a faithful disciple, filled with the Holy Spirit and *research* and *experience* Marian devotions.



Sharing Our Story

Sharing Our Story is the document used in The Diocese of Parramatta to guide the teaching of Religious Education in our Catholic schools. The units explore Bible scripture, Jesus' mission, sacraments and Church teaching. Each Stage works with material that is relevant to the needs of its learners, using resources that engage and support understanding and connect students with the core learning of Catholic Faith.

Stage 3

Unit #1: Faith Communities in my Local Area

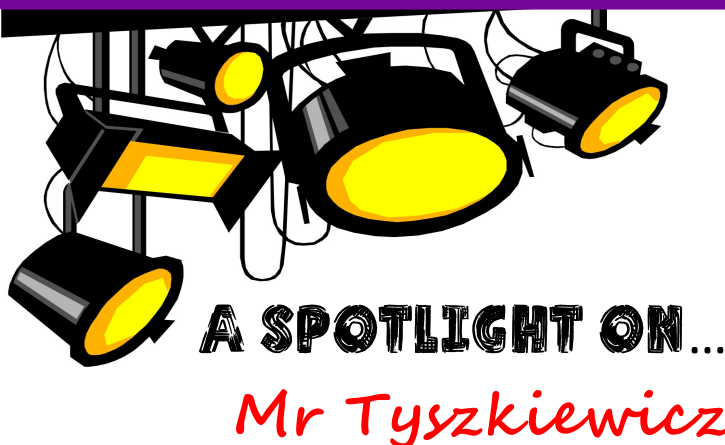
Students will *identify* and research selected Christian churches in the local area, *recall* key facts about the beliefs and communal life of the Anglican and Uniting Churches, *describe* similarities and differences between the worship and ministries of the Catholic, Anglican and Uniting Churches and *list* some of the ways in which Christians seek the unity Jesus prayed for.

Unit #2: Living the Message of Jesus

Students will *recognise* that we are responsible for the decisions we make and their consequences, *identify* and *evaluate* the ways in which people influence our decision making, *interpret* and *apply* Scripture stories which challenge us to live Christian lives and *appreciate* the different ways in which Christians can lead and serve others. The richness of the various cultural expressions and rites of Catholicism that make up the Catholic Church in Australia.

2016 Formation Goal:

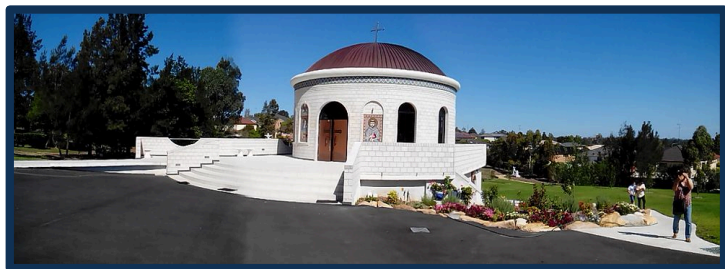
For all students to have a deeper understanding of Sacred Scripture (with a focus on the Gospel of Luke) and it's application to Catholic life.



On Monday 18th July, the staff at St Monica's attended a reflection day at the Shrine of Holy Innocents in Kellyville. The focus of our reflection day was on the Year of Mercy and we spent time in reflecting on how we are advocates for Mercy and what we do in our practice as educators to promote this. This was an excellent opportunity to escape from our everyday busy lives and really sit and reflect on our practice and pedagogy as educators and our personal ethos that are present in our communication and relationships that we have with the staff, students and community of St Monica's.

Our response to our July Mercy Work *Clothe the Naked* will be a 'blue' muffin day for a donation. This will be held on Friday 26 August. All monies will be donated to Aruppe Place at OLMC. In August our focus on *Shelter the Homeless* will involve the students in each class making posters to convince people why we should shelter the homeless. These will be on display in the Mercy hallway.
