

Sharing Our Story

Early Stage 1:

Unit #1: God Loves Me

Students will *identify* special God-given qualities that make them unique, *describe* and *critically reflect* upon ways in which feelings are expressed, *recognise* and *appreciate* that God always loves them and *identify* ways in which they can show their love for their family and friends.

Unit #2: Lent: From Ashes to Easter

Students will *identify* Ash Wednesday as a special day which is the first day of Lent, *recall* the story of the first Palm Sunday, *recognise* special signs and symbols of Lent/Easter and their relevance to the life of Jesus and *develop* an awareness and appreciation of Lent/Easter through participation in activities and celebrations of other classes and/or the whole school.

Stage 1:

Unit #1: Jesus Helps Me to Love

Students will *recognise* Baptism as a ritual of initiation into God's family, where they are called to love, share with, listen to and accept others, *recall* gospel accounts and parables which demonstrate how Jesus encouraged others to grow, *recognise* that Jesus calls them to love one another; and *list* ways of responding to this call and *appreciate* that as part of God's family they are called to seek justice, truth and hope.

Unit #2: Lent: Being Alone

Students will *recall* and *reflect* upon times of being alone, *appreciate* that Jesus prayed to God his Father, *identify* prayer as a means of preparing to celebrate Easter, *recognise* Lent as a particular time for repentance and *participate* in a variety of prayerful experiences.

Stage 2:

Unit #1: Talking and Listening to God

Students will *identify* the values that should inspire the ways in which we communicate with others, *retell* stories from the Bible which tell of the importance of prayer in the lives of God's people, *grow in appreciation* of the prayers and prayer traditions in the Church that have been passed on from generation to generation and *work in groups* to *identify*, *write* and *pray* prayers of praise, thanks, sorrow and petition, *reflect* on the experience of spending time alone in individual prayer.

Unit #2: Lent: Practices and Promises

Students will *identify* and give examples of three forms of Lenten penance, *research* examples of Old Testament covenants, commandments and laws, *describe* how God established a covenant relationship with the people of Israel through Moses, *explain* the importance of the Ten Commandments and laws in the covenant relationship between God and the people of Israel and *propose* ways in which their relationship with God and others can be renewed this Lent through the fulfilment of promises to undertake Lenten practices.

Stage 3:

Unit #1: Servant Leadership

Students will *compare* and *contrast* different styles of leadership, *identify* and *explain* characteristics of the servant leadership displayed by Moses and Jesus and *apply* the Christian ideals of leadership in their school community.


Unit #2: Easter Triduum: Crossroads

Students will *recall* and *explore* 'crossroad' situations in their own lives when they were faced with making decisions, *explain* how Jesus, Pilate, Judas, Peter and the other disciples were confronted with 'crossroad' situations, *link* events of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection with the liturgies celebrated in Holy Week and Easter and *dramatise* Christian responses to real-life dilemmas.



The formation goal allows students and teachers to focus on an area that needs further development within the school and allows for students to achieve and perform at the best of their ability.

2017 Goal: For all students to have a deeper understanding of Scripture and its application to Catholic life

As part of our whole school Formation Goal for 2017, teachers will be working on the following strategies with their students:

- Interpreting and responding to Scripture passages at three levels (literal, spiritual and application);
- Engaging in reading and writing activities when responding to and interpreting Scripture;
- Apply comprehension strategies to understand Scripture, including questioning and inferring;
- Using a range of protocols to reflect and self-asses their understanding, and;
- Link ideas across other Key Learning Areas.

Staff will continue their Professional Learning around interpreting Scripture and how to implement successful strategies in the classroom.

There will also be ideas in each RE Newsletter to assist parents in:

- Supporting your child in their class learning
- Having focused family prayer time
- Initiating conversations with your child when they are completing home learning tasks

Franciscan Shrine of Holy Innocents

As part of our Lenten Units being taught prior to Holy Week this year, Stage 2 and Stage 3 will be participating in a Religious Education PBL Unit, integrating the Lent and Easter units of work. As part of this project, students in Stage 2 and 3 will be visiting the Franciscan Shrine at Kellyville. Located on the grounds of the Conventual Franciscan Friary of Mount Saint Francis, Kellyville, The Franciscan Shrine of the Holy Innocents and Garden of the Immaculate to represent and promote a culture of life. On the site of the Shrine there is a chapel with an impressive hand painted domed ceiling, icons of St Francis and St Clare and a landscaped garden that has sculptures of the 14 Stations of the Cross. The chapel also has one of the five sets of 'Mercy' doors that were an integral part of the Year of Mercy in 2016.

The students will take part in a reflection walk of the Stations of the Cross, followed by a Easter Liturgy. The liturgy will be held on the grounds at the Shrine. All students will have reflection time and an opportunity to walk around the grounds and reflect in quiet prayer.

This is also an open invitation for all parents and families in our school community to attend this reflection time and liturgy. If you are interested in attending, please see me for further details of the location and parking.



Ash Wednesday is an important day in the Church liturgical calendar. It marks the first day of Lent, the beginning of a period where we take time to pray, almsgiving and make promises to Jesus. On Ash Wednesday, Father Fernando placed a cross made from ashes on our foreheads. This cross reminds us that we need to try to be more like Jesus.

A new school year always brings renewed energy and motivation for our students returning to school. Our Opening Schools Mass was celebrated on Sunday 5 February. It was a great start to our school year, where Father Fernando addressed us in the homily about the symbols of 'salt and light'. St Monica's will be using these symbols as part of our focus theme this year, which will be *Discipleship*.
