

To parents, students, teachers and all those who are part of the St Monica's school community:

As the end of the year comes to close, we begin to prepare ourselves for the miraculous birth of Jesus Christ. It begins with Advent, commencing on Sunday 27 November. Advent is a time of expectant waiting. We will wait in hope, faith and love as we prepare ourselves and our families for the Birth of Jesus. The symbol of Advent is the Advent Wreath. Each part of the wreath has a special significance and meaning:

- **Greenery:** The wreath is made of evergreens, symbolising continuous life
- Holly: The Holly reminds us of the crown of thorns
- Candles: The four candles symbolise the four weeks leading up to Christmas. Three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles

In Term 3 Stage 2 were split into Year 3 and 4 groups for our Religion topics. Year 4 have been looking at Reconciliation with reference to God's forgiveness and healing, which is their Religious Literacy Assessment topic. The two Scripture passages we have been looking at are 'The Parable of the Prodigal Son' and 'Jesus and Zacchaeus'. We were fortunate to have Father Regie visit us to speak about scriptures. talked about Не UNCONDITIONAL LOVE and that he will always forgive us which really resonated with the students. Many of them spoke about the unconditional love their parents show towards them, which is so lovely to hear and so good for them to know they are loved. The students' have identified key words from these scriptures which helped their retelling of the stories and enabled them to understand the Literal Sense of the Gospel. Looking at the Spiritual and Application Senses has given them a deeper understanding of these Gospels and how it relates to their life.

Social Justice: St Vinnie's Christmas Hamper Appeal

Our St Vincent de Paul Christmas Appeal will begin on Monday 27 November. We will be collecting a range of <u>non-perishable</u> items that will be donated to St Vincent de Paul and used to make hampers. These Christmas hampers will be donated to families in our community who are less fortunate, so they have the opportunity to celebrate Christmas with their families and friends.

We would like to ask that every child donates at least one non-perishable item to the Christmas hamper in their classroom. Some food suggestions include tinned food (vegetables, fruit, baked beans, tuna, etc), pasta, cereal, jam, soup, noodles, bottles or drink or juice, or anything else that has a long expiry date.

The hampers will be donated to the St Vincent de Paul who will then distribute where needed.

Social Justice: Refugee Mission Tree

The Social Justice Team are working on projects to implement throughout the month of December to support people in our local area. The first project is called Mission Tree. The team have created Christmas tags, each with a different gender and age on them. Each **family** will have the opportunity to select a tag from the Mission Tree and prepare a Christmas gift for this child. You will wrap and return your gift and place it, with the Christmas tag, under the Mission Tree. These gifts will be donated to the refugees at Arrupe Place.

As the year comes to a close, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the 2017 Social Justice Team. This team has been working tirelessly this year to raise awareness and money for people in in need within our local community, in particular the refugees at Arrupe Place.

Throughout the year the team have worked on many projects including:

- ✓ Term 1: Girls from Oz. The team raised money for students in rural Australia to participate in a Creative Arts programs
- ✓ Term 2: Arrupe Place Winter Appeal. The team collected monetary donations over a week and used the money to purchase supermarket vouchers for refugees to use during winter.
- ✓ Term 3: Walking with Refugees. Presenting at fortnightly assemblies to the whole school to raise awareness on refugees within our local community and on the Diocesan year-long mission: Walking with Refugees.
- ✓ Term 4: Mission Tree. The SJT are collecting new toys to donate to child refugees at Arrupe Place.
- ✓ Term 4: Christmas Appeal. Collecting food for donation to St Vincent de Paul for families in need during Christmas time.

A lot of time, effort and preparation has gone into organising these events. Thank you to everyone in the team. Applications are now open for the 2018 SJT. Please see Miss Rosewell for more details. Applications close on Friday 1 December.
