Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Over the last week or so Mrs Mason and I have been reading the Semester One progress reports for every child at St Monica's. It has been a privilege and a pleasure to do so. These reports are a true celebration of the learning and achievement of the children. They acknowledge the tremendous effort the children have put into their learning over the semester.

Please focus on your child's strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core learning areas. Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort needs attention, then this gives your child direction on what they need to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, speak to your child about how pleasing this is and how it has a positive impact on their learning.

The reports celebrate the passion and expertise of the teachers as they guide and support the children through their learning journey. They show the difference it makes when parents support and encourage their children's learning through what is said and done at home. Lastly, they give direction and some key learning goals and areas for improvement that the children can work towards in Semester Two. I encourage all parents to take this report as an opportunity to praise, encourage and challenge your child in a constructive way.

When the reports arrive please focus on the comments that have been included on the report. Please remember that the E-A grading system is a Commonwealth Government legislative requirement and not something that our school has implemented on our own. If your child is receiving a 'C' grade they are performing where they need to be at this stage of their learning in their particular grade.

All parents are invited to follow up their child's report with an interview with their child's teacher. It is always helpful when your child is part of the interviewing process as this gives a clear indication to your child/children that their education is important and that we work together as a team to help ensure that they work to reach their full potential. Below I have provided some tips that may assist during the interview process.

- Children learn in different ways. All teachers want to see each student treated as an
 individual and it is important that we do not compare your child to others in the class
 or to their siblings.
- Talk to your child about the conference. Find out if they have any concerns about their learning or relationships. Tell your child that you intend to work with the teacher.
- Be ready to collaborate with the school. Teachers will always be positive and always have your child's best interest in mind. Respond tactfully and work with us to find a suitable positive solution.
- Do not be afraid to ask questions if you do not understand something or require further clarification. Not understanding can quickly lead to misunderstanding.

Some good areas to discuss in the interview may include:

- · Child's strengths
- Areas for development in Semester Two
- Your child's interaction with their peers
- Is your child working to their potential?
- Is your child contributing to class discussions?


Library Monitors

Hot Tips for helping your child at home with Reading Comprehension

This year our English goal is improving reading comprehension. Students in all classes have been focusing on what good readers do before, during and after reading. They are continuing to develop and implement reading strategies.

Reading at home with children and helping them practice specific reading strategies can improve their ability to comprehend. Each newsletter there will be a new strategy that you can use at home when reading with your child to help them improve their reading comprehension.

Listen to your child read aloud everyday. Strong fluency helps to foster strong comprehension. Talk to your child about book characters, what happened in the book, and what he/she liked best about the book.

Make inferences

We infer by combining what we already know (our prior knowledge) with clues or evidence from the text. For example if we read "The boy put on his hat and sunglasses before going outside," we can infer that it is a sunny day. Talking about what you can actually see/hear (literal) and what you can infer (literal + prior knowledge and other clues) will help students to be able to make inferences about texts.

Summarise

Talking about what happened in the text gives your child an opportunity to share any other questions, comments, connections, inferences they may have.

Talk about which part they liked/disliked, did they enjoy the text, have they learnt something new? What were the main ideas? Can you describe what happened using only three sentences? Ask them what was important, is there a message?

Summarising helps them to put ideas into their own words.

Remember: Good readers unconsciously create visual images in their heads while they are reading. It's all part of the comprehension process. While you are reading to your child, think out loud about the images you see or the questions that may arise. That means explaining the ideas, pictures, questions, and connections that go through your mind as you read a text.

Snapchat Privacy Settings

Snapchat is advertised as a messaging app where messages "disappear". However it is not 100% safe for sending photos and posts. Snapchat photos CAN be copied via screen capture, saved then shared on to others.

To set up privacy settings on Snapchat. Open - 1.Click Ghost icon - 2. "Settings" - Scroll to 3/4. "Who Can..." Set both settings to "My Friends" to prevent messages from strangers 5.Turn off "Quick Add", 6. Set up Login Verification also to secure your account from hackers.








Setup Screen Passcode On Apple Mobile

Set up a secret screen lock passcode or Touch I.D. You can set it so that it locks immediately or after a few minutes of inactivity. Go to your device "Settings" - "Passcode" - "Turn Passcode On" - "Set up a pass code" - set the time delay - then exit out to save. Set Touch ID to most secure settings.
