How is your Jar Filled?

A philosophy professor stood before his class and had some items in front of him. When class began, wordlessly he picked up a large empty jar and proceeded to fill it with rocks. At the end of the professor's demonstration, one of the students took the jar (full of rocks, pebbles and sand) and added a full glass of water, the water being absorbed by the sand.


Moral: whatever your life is filled with, there will always be some room left for more if you set your priorities!
