# Monica's Matters

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Dear Parents. Staff and Students.

Next week is 'National Child Protection Week', a campaign that is held annually across Australia to raise awareness of child abuse prevention.

Protecting children from sexual exploitation is a whole community responsibility. It is a timely reminder for parents and teachers that we need to have age appropriate conversations with our children about personal safety and what to do if they find themselves in a situation that makes them feel uncomfortable. Children need to be made aware that unwanted touching by anyone (family, friends or strangers) is not OK and they have a right to say NO.

At school the Personal Development syllabus outlines for the teachers the knowledge and understanding outcomes for the students in the strand 'Safe Living'. This strand focuses on developing in students a commitment and an ability to act in ways that will keep themselves and others safe from harm. Students are given opportunities in their lessons to analyse various situations and investigate ways of behaving safely in these situations. They learn how to deal with emergencies and how to minimise risks to themselves and others. Above all, the students learn that each one of them has a right to be safe and to feel safe always.

The following outlines some of the themes that are covered in the strand 'Safe Living' in each of our stages:

**Early Stage One** - identify people who keep them safe, talk about feeling safe/ unsafe, explore actions for safety eg No-Go-Tell and they describe safe places to play.

**Stage One** - compare the characteristics of places where they feel safe/unsafe, role play emergency situations, demonstrate actions they can take when they feel unsafe and they identify people that can help them.

**Stage Two** - identify people from whom they can seek advice and support in emergency situations, compare the characteristics of people and situations that cause students to feel safe and unsafe.

**Stage Three** - demonstrate ways to improve unsafe environments, practise emergency response procedures, devise strategies to respond to risky and dangerous situations and they identify individuals and services in the community that help protect their wellbeing.

#### Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states:

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
