schools, like ours, are using to support their behaviour management.

Mrs Harrison, Miss Rosewell and Mrs Gardoni shared our journey towards the implementation of PBS4L at St Monica's. Then all the remaining teachers on staff took all the educators on a tour of our school showcasing our school rules, our reward system, bee mascots, signage, lesson plans, student videos and our focus for the week at our assembly area.

We then were able to listen to 6 other schools as they shared exemplar PBS4L practices at their school.

Last Friday our staff participated in a Formation and Religious Education Day

held at St Monica's. We began our day with a meditative and spiritual prayer. This provided the teachers with an opportunity to reflect on the important things in life and have quiet time to contemplate their priorities. Following prayer, the teachers were engaged in developing learning activities focusing on our school goal: To develop a deeper understanding of Scripture and its application to Catholic life, using the sense of Scripture. Throughout the year teachers have been working on using the Three Senses when teaching Religious Education, with a specific focus on the Literal Sense. On Friday, everyone participated in extending their knowledge and skills around the Spiritual and Application Senses. It was an opportunity for teachers to continue their learning to use in their Religious Education units.

Mathematical Assessment Interviews

A note will be sent home to each family informing them of the online booking procedure.

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states:

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
