Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Today we begin our Lenten journey for 2017 by receiving the Ashes with a most reverent, prayerful liturgy. The ashes with which we were marked on Ash Wednesday symbolise our beginning and our ending and challenge us to translate our intentions and prayers into real deeds of love, faith and generosity during the forty days of Lent. The clear direction that Jesus gives us through Lent is that our lives will have periods of struggle and desolation and challenge. It is during these times of personal struggle and desolation that God is closest to us.

The Lenten period provides us a great opportunity to renew and deepen our relationship with God by stripping away some of the clutter in our spiritual lives. We can do this by emulating the example of Christ- by fasting, giving and praying. Jesus also tells us that giving, praying and fasting should not be self-seeking or boastful, but rather motivated by love. Ultimately it is through doing these things that we can turn back to God. The season of Lent will conclude on Easter Sunday when we celebrate the Lord's resurrection.

Catholic Schools Week 2017: 'Learning connected'

This year from 5 - 11 March 2017 St Monica's, will join with Catholic schools across NSW and the ACT to celebrate Catholic Schools Week (CSW).

Our theme for CSW 2017 is 'Learning connected', building on Pope Francis' statement that 'Everything is connected'. This sense of connection calls for shared responsibility for the care of nature and our human relationships in a changing world. Pope Francis has addressed his second encyclical letter 'Laudato Si' to 'every person living on this planet' in order to start an inclusive dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet.

'Laudato Si' means 'Praise be to you' and it has the subtitle On Care for Our Common *Home*. In the encyclical letter, Pope Francis discusses the harm humankind has caused on earth and calls on every person to make necessary changes in our lives to protect our planet. Laudato Si' deals with many environmental issues including pollution, climate change, drought, loss of biodiversity and the decline in the quality of human life.

Pope Francis calls on the Church and humankind to acknowledge the current environmental challenges and to join him in embarking on a new path. This encyclical is written with both hope and resolve, looking to our common future. As Catholic schools, we can play an essential role in shaping the future of our planet by working together to care for our common home. Our world is a gift from God and we are called to act as both stewards and protectors during our time here. It is our responsibility to care for our world and make it a better place for the next generation.

Each morning next week at our assembly we will respond to Pope Francis' encyclical letter in prayer.

School Goals

Recently I shared with families at the Parent Information nights our three school goals for 2017. These goals give the staff direction and focus to our teaching and learning throughout 2017. Our goals are in response to our identified needs and through careful examination of data ie NAPLAN, Early Years Assessment, PAT-r, Religious Literacy and student work samples.

The goals are **SMART** goals which means that they are:

Specific- the focus is on the whole school Measureable- displayed on the data wall

Ambitious- high expectations for growth are set

Relevant- based on the data

Time bound- achieved within the year.

In 2017 St Monica's school goals are:

Mission Goal: To develop a deeper understanding of Scripture and its application to Catholic life.

Literacy Goal:

For all students by the end of 2017 to demonstrate growth as readers through improvement in their comprehension skills. Comprehension is one of the most challenging issues facing teachers of reading. Reading comprehension is important because without it students are not truly reading. Teachers know what good readers do and this year as a staff we will be exploring explicit comprehension strategies so that every student at St Monica's grows in their comprehension of texts.

All teachers have been focused on activating prior knowledge in each of their reading sessions over the past few weeks. Before the children commence reading the teacher encourage their students to:

- Share what they already know about the topic
- Include what they have experienced personally
- Recall what they may have read, seen on television or in a movie

Some children may have prior knowledge but do not make connections to the text so it is important that teachers and other students in the group help the student make those links.

Numeracy Goal:

For all students by the end of 2017 to increase by at least one growth point in Place Value. **Educational Research Project- Monash University—Multiplicative Thinking**We are very excited that all teachers at St Monica's will be participating in a professional learning course called Multiplicative Thinking with the staff of Christ the King, North Rocks to support our 2017 Numeracy Goal. This course is presented by the Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta in partnership with Dr Ann Downton from Monash University. The professional learning is part of a research project investigating the effects of teacher impact on the improvement of Stage 2 students development of multiplicative thinking. The staff will be involved in six sessions and will explore multiplicative structures that encourage multiplicative thinking.

All Stage 2 teachers and students will play a significant role in the study.

A letter will be sent home to every Stage 2 student outlining the project details.

A further letter will be sent to Stage 2 students **who have been selected** to participate in the project.

Multiplication and Division

Students who have been identified as vulnerable in these domains to demonstrate accelerated growth and achieve at least 'on the way growth' points according to their grade.

High Expectations

At St Monica's we have very clear expectations regarding the behaviour of all members of our community.



Sometimes behaviour challenges do occur and at these times we need to work together to resolve matters quickly and to ensure that the children learn from what has happened. Please do not hesitate to contact us should you have any questions or concerns so that we can address them for you. By working together we can help all the children to be the best person they can be! The support and encouragement of everyone in this regard is greatly appreciated.

This is an ideal opportunity to support our community of St Monica's and learn more about the great things that take place in Catholic schools every day.

Our school has a supportive and talented community of teachers, parents, carers, P&F, clergy, parishioners and support staff who work together to give students the best education possible.

This special week on the Catholic Schools' calendar provides an opportunity for the community to recognise our committed and gifted teachers and support staff for their work in encouraging success, promoting discipline, supporting creativity and instilling compassion in our young people.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all your support of St Monica's and look forward to celebrating Catholic Schools Week with you.

In part this states "A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term." This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.






