Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Today we commenced the Church season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a preparation time for Easter, the focal point of the Church's liturgical year. During this time of Lent we are reminded of the love that God has shown in sending Jesus to us. Lent is a time of thanksgiving for what God has done for us and during the 40 days of Lent we try and focus in a special way on turning our hearts towards God.

Today, all the students had ashes placed on their foreheads in the sign of the cross to remind them of Christ's death, and the need to repent and turn toward God. The words that Father Regie and Father Ephriam Lam used, 'Repent and follow the Gospel" may be a good motto for us all to follow throughout the 40 days of Lent as well as further through the year.

During Lent there are two days of penance Ash Wednesday and Good Friday where, we as Catholics, abstain from meat and also fast.

During Lent we are all encouraged to perform any of the following:

Prayer- for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to the church; reading the Bible; praying the rosary; attending Stations of the Cross (every Friday night during Lent starting from Friday 16th February 7pm English / 8pm Chinese).

Fasting - adults may choose to not eat meat, sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food or drink and donating the money to Project Compassion. For children this may mean reducing their time using the ipad,/technology games and limiting television.

Almsgiving - this does not mean necessarily in the monetary sense but could extend to acts of kindness, doing jobs around the house without being asked, giving special attention to someone who is alone on the playground or saying hello to someone with a smile.

Fast from words that pollute......feast on phrases that purify.
Fast from complaining......feast on appreciation.

Open Morning—Wednesday 7 March

An 'Open Morning' for prospective 2019 St Monica's families will take place on Wednesday 7 March. We will have two sessions commencing at **9:30 am** and then another one at **10.00 am**.

The sessions will commence with a welcome in the Community Room and an overview of our school, followed by children from Year 6 who will show our visitors our learning spaces and focus on our day to day school life.

There will be time for questions after the students finish the school tours.

We have been advertising the event through the Parish Bulletin our school website and Mrs Mason and I will be visiting local preschools.

Please let family, friends and neighbours know about our open morning if they have a child due to start school in 2019.

If any of our families have a child starting school in 2019 please let Mrs Abood know in the office so that we have some idea of the number of places we will have in Kindergarten next year.

2018 School Goals

Each year the Leadership team and all the teachers identify areas of learning need that focus on the areas of Formation, Literacy and Numeracy.

• **Formation**: In 2018 the students and teachers will continue to deepen their understanding of scripture and be able to interpret and respond to scripture passages at three different levels: Literal, Spiritual and Application.

The learning spaces will continue to have word walls, biblical timelines and images displayed. Teachers will continue to have the Learning Intentions on their whiteboards and the teachers and students will jointly construct the Success Criteria for all their learning activities.

- <u>Literacy</u>: Our goal this year will focus on Writing and in particular generating ideas with the students, focusing on the structure for persuasive, imaginative and informative writing. All students will be encouraged to plan and draft their writing for a specific purpose. The teachers will be modelling daily writing strategies and behaviours and integrate grammar within the modelling to assist students with their understanding and composition of texts.
- <u>Numeracy</u>: For the past few years we have had a focus on number operations, counting and place value. This year we are focusing on the Measurement and Geometry strands. Teachers have noticed that some students experience difficulty when applying skills and knowledge of concepts in other Key Learning Areas.

We are very excited that we have been invited to be in a diocesan pilot program with two other primary schools. We will be supported by academic partners, Dr Ann Downton and Dr Sharon Livy from the Monash University. The teachers will have an opportunity to develop geometric reasoning to assist them in teaching their students. They will explore tasks and investigations using the Mathematics syllabus and have the opportunity to work with other educators to develop resources.

This project will commence on <u>Monday 30 April</u> (1st day of Term 2) with a Staff Development Day with the other two schools.

Please note <u>Monday 23 July</u> (Term 3 Week 1) is now a <u>School Day</u> and <u>not a Staff</u> <u>Development Day</u> as previously advertised.

Mobile Phones

Each year parents who request permission for their child to bring a mobile phone to school are asked to do so <u>in writing</u> to the Principal. <u>Students who brought phones to school last year are therefore required to provide a letter this year explaining the need for the phone at school.</u>

Permission is only granted to those students who travel home on a bus or who walk home. On arrival at school the switched off phone is to be handed in at the School Office where the student is to sign in the phone. In the afternoon the phone will be sent to the classroom via the office bags. Students are to switch the phone on and place the phone in their school bag before leaving school.

Anaphylaxis / Allergies—Food Awareness

A number of students at school suffer from anaphylaxis and allergies. During the last week several students have brought food to school which has contained nuts and nut products. In order for us to provide for the needs of all our students we ask that you **only send food to school** that is **nut free**. Thank you for your co-operation.

Dealing With Playground Issues

Please go through the correct channels when an issue arises concerning your child and another student. Let matters relating to children be dealt with at school by our staff. **Do not approach children or other parents when an issue occurs.** Approaching someone else's child translates into a Child Protection issue that can be avoided if the issue is brought to the attention of the child's teacher or a member of the School Leadership Team.

Pow Wow

For a number of years Pow Wow (playgroup for pre-schoolers-babies - 5 years) has been very active within our community. Most of the children from the Pow Wow group in 2018 started Kindergarten this year and were part of this group for a number of years. We are now looking to start with a new group of parents and children.

Pow Wow is held in the Community Room each Monday during the school term from 9;00am - 10:30 am. Parents or grandparents have an opportunity to meet new friends over morning tea while the children play. Over the years toy and craft resources have been purchased and will be available to use. If you and your child/children would be interested in Pow Wow please come along next Monday 19 February.

Spare Underwear / Socks

All students (K-6) are requested to have a **spare pair of underwear** and socks (K-2) in their school bag. The school office has a very limited supply of underwear / clothing and sizes are mainly 4-6. If your child does borrow clothing from the school office, kindly launder it and return as soon as possible. Thank you for your co-operation.



Acceptable Use of Information Technologies—Student Policy

Each year, every student is required to sign the **Student Policy for the Acceptable Use of Information Technologies**. The last sheet of the policy is to be **signed by both student and parents** and then returned to your child's homeroom teacher. (*A copy was sent home with each child last week*). Upon receipt of the signed sheet at school your child will be granted access to the school's technology.

Kiss and Drop

Parents are able to "**Kiss and Drop**" children to school in the mornings.

The following guidelines apply for safety reasons:

- · Cars must enter the school grounds via Daking Street only.
- Students must <u>always exit</u> the car via the driver's side only.
- Farewell parents **before** getting out of the car.
- Parents are not to get out of the car to get bags out of the boot or to farewell children. Bags should be with the children ready to exit the car.
- · Children walk into the school grounds via the gate.
- Parents are always welcome to park their car and walk their child/children into the school grounds if they are not able to comply with the safety requests in the "Kiss and Drop" zone.

Afternoon Pick -Up Arrangements

At St Monica's we have the provision for a drive through pick up service for our parents and students which is convenient and easy to use.

Please display your family name label in your window.

<u>For the safety of all our students and staff, the following guidelines must be</u> followed:

- Only **one** line of traffic enters the playground (from Daking Street)
- Students are to enter the car from the driver's side only.
- Parents parked in the Parish carpark must exit from the gate nearest to the Hall. Please note that the gate near the hall must be kept closed until 5:30pm each afternoon.
- Please **use the pedestrian crossing** to enter the carpark. Parents are **not** to walk with their child through the traffic to exit into the Parish carpark.
- The school gates open at 2:45pm each afternoon for parents to sit in the waiting area and for cars to start moving into the grounds. Please ensure that you do not block the Presbytery driveway in the afternoon during the pick up time.



2018 SEASONS FOR GROWTH PROGRAM

The Seasons for Growth school program is based on the belief that grief is normal and can be a valuable part of life and that children need to be provided with the opportunity to examine how grief, as a result of death, separation or divorce has impacted on their lives.

The program is based on research, which highlights the importance of social support in dealing with grief.

Seasons for Growth

- Assists students in understanding that the emotions associated with their losses are normal.
- Encourages the expressions of thoughts and emotions.
- Helps restores self- confidence and self-esteem.
- Develops a peer support network.

Mary-Jo Mason

The program caters for different age levels where groups are limited to 4-6 children. The children are withdrawn from class once a week for 40 minutes. Each session is facilitated by the same Companion, and children participate in eight formal sessions, one celebration session and two 'reconnector' sessions.

Mrs Mary-Jo Mason is the trained Companion at St Monica's this year.

The children must have parental permission to attend the program.

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states:

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
