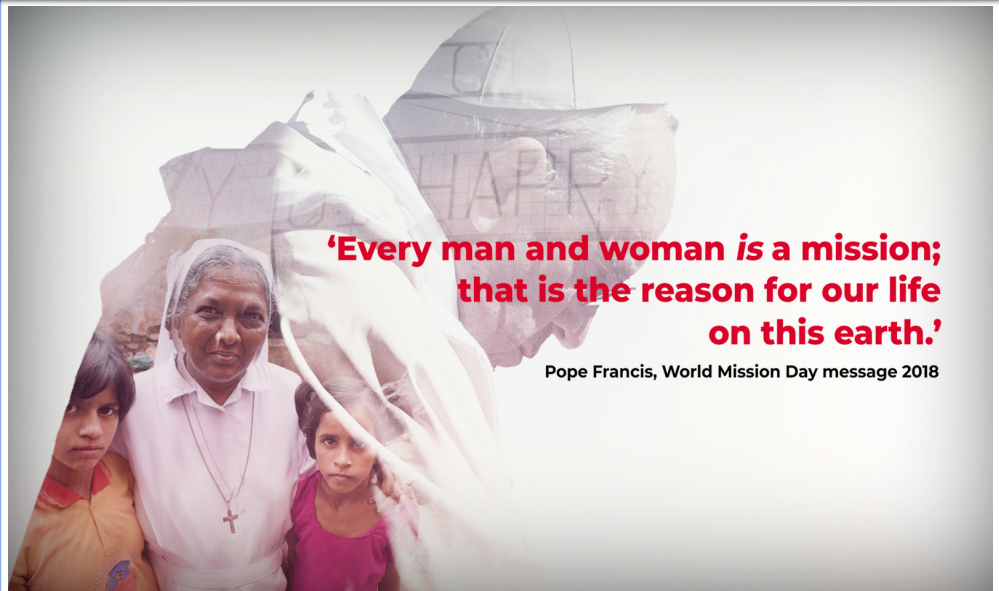

A Spotlight On... Miss Bagnall

October is World Mission month for Christians around the world. During this time we are reminded to think about what mission means to each of us. Currently in Year Two we are working on our Mission unit, we have discussed what Mission means to us and how we can be missionaries every day. The students understand how they can use their own actions to make a difference to others. We have been looking at how we can be missionaries like Jesus and have had a focus on Pope Francis as a role model for us. The Pope sends a message each year for World Mission month. This year he encourages us to go out into the world and use their voices. This allows us to reflect on own actions and how they can influence and make a difference in the world.

With a focus on the three senses in the Diocese, we, as a school, have been on a journey that has involved delving deeper in the scripture through the literal, spiritual and application senses. I use the three senses to help us go deeper into the scripture, to allow both my students and myself to have a deeper appreciation for the message of the scripture. We work together to focus on the literal sense, allowing students to think about what we actually know about the scripture passages. The spiritual sense is where we work towards understanding how we can link this to our own faith. Allowing students to look at the application sense, helps them to understand how they can apply their deeper understanding to their own lives. With our current unit, it's how we can be missionaries, just like Jesus.

Using the senses to break down the Mission unit has given students a deeper understanding of what Mission means in their lives. Having the Pope as a real life role model is making it relevant to the students and has allowed us to try and use this understanding to break down the spiritual sense a bit more. The senses is an ongoing journey for us, just like our journey as missionaries, but one that we continue to walk together. I'll leave you with a quote that the Pope shared; "Never think that you have nothing to offer, or that nobody needs you. Many people need you. Think about it! Each of you, think in your heart: many people need me"

Social Justice Team Refugee Mission Tree

The Social Justice Team is working on projects to implement throughout the month of December to support people in our local area. The first project is called Mission Tree. The team have created Christmas tags and you have the option this year to choose an age and gender your gift is for. Each family will have the opportunity to select a tag from the Mission Tree and prepare a Christmas gift for this child. You will wrap and return your gift and place it, with the Christmas tag, under the Mission Tree. These gifts will be donated to the refugees at Arrupe Place.



As the year comes to a close, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the 2018 Social Justice Team. This team has been working tirelessly this year to raise awareness and money for people in in need within our local community, in particular the refugees at Arrupe Place. Throughout the year the team have worked on many projects including:

- ✓ Term 1: **Project Compassion.** The team raised money to provide education to children in disadvantaged countries. We raised over \$1200.
- ✓ Term 1: **Wear Green.** We collected donations on St Patrick's Day. Everyone wore green mufti to commemorate the Feast day of St Patrick. All monies collected were donated to St Vincent de Paul.
- ✓ Term 2: **The Heat is On Winter Appeal.** The team collected socks, scarves, beanies, gloves and blankets to support the homeless in our local community. These items were donated to St Vincent de Paul.
- ✓ Term 3: **Make it Rain Drought Campaign.** This project continued over a period of weeks and included a mufti day. Over \$1000 was raised and donated to the Farmers who have been devastated by the drought.
- ✓ Term 4: **Mission Tree.** The SJT are collecting new toys to donate to child refugees at Arrupe Place.
- ✓ Term 4: **Christmas Appeal.** Collecting food for donation to St Vincent de Paul for families in need during Christmas time.

A lot of time, effort and preparation has gone into organising these events. Thank you to everyone in the team. Applications are now open for the 2019 S.J.T. Please see Miss Rosewell for more details. Applications close on Monday 26 November.

2018 Formation Goal:

For all students to have a deeper understanding of Sacred Scripture and it's application to Catholic life.

THREE SENSES IN STAGE 3

In class, we were learning how to use the framework of the Three Senses to develop a better understanding of Scripture. Here is what we learnt so far.

The definition of the Literal Sense is when your thinking about what you know about the scripture - who, what, when, where, why and how. The Spiritual Sense is when your thinking about how the scripture links to God, Jesus and the Sacraments, as well as learning about how it links to your own faith. Last but not least, the Application Sense is when your're thinking about the actions, words and thoughts you will take on to change your life, thinking about how you can change your relationship with God.

Last term we undertook many challenges when we did activities that involved the Three Senses. We responded to the questions the senses were asking us to think about, we did mind maps with drawings and we applied the senses to scripture passages that we were reading. You might think that that sounds easy but trust us we learnt from experience it's way more difficult than it sounds.

Moreover, when you're thinking about answering the questions the three senses ask, you need to use your prior knowledge as well as you use the information you have just learnt. In order for you to understand the questions, you need to be able to explain the questions.

The Three Senses are not only used in class they can be used in the real world, for example in church Father Ephraim uses the questions the spiritual sense asks you, and the application sense is a sense we use every day, every day we ask ourselves how we can improve our lives and how we can change our relationship with God. The literal sense is a sense we use in church as well; we think about the scripture or the Gospel being read and we ask ourselves what do we know about this scripture.

Another activity we did in Religion was to use protocols to enhance our learning. We wrote on post-it notes the categories of the three senses and categorise our information. We would then swap our post-it notes with a partner and share our responses.

Overall, the three senses have really helped us to have more of a deeper understanding of Scripture. We will continue to develop a stronger understanding of the Three Senses throughout the term.
