Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

All the teachers attended a Staff Development Day on the first day of this term on Geometric Reasoning. The day was facilitated by Dr Ann Downton and Dr Sharyn Livy from Monash University. The teachers explored key ideas related to geometric reasoning and spatial awareness.

Last Thursday, Dr Ann Downton and Lead Mathematics Teachers in the Diocese spent the whole day at St Monica's and worked side by side with the teachers and students in the learning space exploring geometric concepts.

The NSW Mathematics Syllabus K-6 clearly outlines the learning that is expected in each stage. Below is a brief outline of what is taught in each stage:

Early Stage 1: the students have lots of experiences in handling, describing, sorting and representing Three Dimensional objects (3D) and Two Dimensional shapes (2D) around them. They also have opportunities to manipulate a variety of real objects (for eg packaging) and shapes. This is crucial to the development of imagery, language and representation. It is important that the students also experience shapes that are presented in a variety of different ways and orientations for eg tall, skinny triangles, short fat triangles, right angle triangles.

Stage 1 explore 3D and 2D in greater detail. The students are encouraged to describe the objects and shapes using their own language first and then the teachers gradually introduce the correct terminology. Developing and retaining mental images of objects and shapes is an important skill for Stage 1 and it is crucial to the development of appropriate levels of individual language and representation. The students also develop an understanding that changing the orientation of an object or shape does not change its features or its name.

Stage 2 describe key features of 3D and 2D. They investigate, make and identify the variety of nets that can be used to create a particular prism. They communicate with correct language such as cone, cube, cylinder, prism, quadrilateral, parallelogram, rhombus, trapezium, vertices, curved and flat surfaces, faces and edges. The students are expected to be able to distinguish between regular and irregular shapes.

Stage 3 continue to develop their skills of visual imagery, including the ability to perceive and hold an appropriate mental image of an object and to predict the orientation or shape of an object that has been moved or altered. In Stage 3, the formal names for particular prisms and pyramids are introduced while the students are engaged in their construction and representation.

On the last page of the newsletter today I have included a sample of the tasks that the students have been completing over the past two weeks in each of the stages. Parents are at any time able to view the learning in each of the spaces as the teachers are displaying all the student's work. A good time may be as the children are unpacking their bag at 8:30 am each day as they can explain the task.

Peer Review

This year Stage One (Mrs Werner and Miss Bagnall) have been selected to provide documentation (timetables, teaching program, student work samples, assessment and differentiated learning activities) for English and Science.

Mrs Mason and I have also been requested to present documentation for the following areas that will also be audited: Attendance, Working With Children Checks, Child Protection documentation, Teacher Accreditation, Complaints and Grievances Management.

Pentecost

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday. The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for fiftieth day. Pentecost Sunday ends the season of Easter. The Disciples were gathered together when they experienced the Holy Spirit empowering them. In Christian tradition, Pentecost is celebrated as the arrival of the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus, who inspired the Disciples to spread the Gospel of Jesus and gather believers to form what would eventually become the Church. For the weeks following the death of Jesus, the Disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realised that the Spirit had breathed upon them urging them to action, they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realise His message in the world.

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states:

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
