Semester One Assessment and Reporting

Over the past few weeks the teachers have been using their knowledge and assessment data to write a report on each of their students. All bookwork assessment tasks and student observations has been aligned with the syllabus outcomes, scope and sequences and expected targets.

Teachers collaborate daily with their grade partners to reflect, analyse and compare their student's work samples against the syllabus outcomes. At the same time the teachers are evaluating the success of their teaching strategies as well as forward planning. This forward planning then is transferred into each teacher's new lesson learning intention and success criteria in the particular Key Learning Area.

The teachers have high expectations for our students' learning. As each family receives their child's Semester One Report, please remember to focus on the descriptors for each of the grades E-A. These descriptors have been included at the top of page 2 on your child's report. Please also pay particular attention to your child's effort in each of the Key Learning Areas and also their application in work habits.

As you are reading your child's report please consider the following:

- Look at the strengths first as these may not necessarily be in English and Mathematics.
- Take into account your child's effort and their attitude towards their learning- If the report indicates that more effort is required, your child will then have their goal for Semester Two. If your child is putting in the required effort, affirm your child about how pleasing this is and how it has a positive impact on their learning.
- Form a picture of your child's progress as a member within a social setting- How is your child interacting with his/her peers ? This interaction will influence their happiness and well-being at school.
- Share the report with your child and ask their opinion about how they have performed over the semester and discuss their concerns. Remember your child will attend the Parent/Teacher Inter view with you and will have the opportunity to contribute to the conversation.

Please ensure you have booked an interview with your child's teacher. Instructions on how to book an interview have been sent home and can also be found on Page 6 of this newsletter.

Semester One Reports will be sent home next Thursday, 21 June in preparation for Parent/ Teacher interviews that will be conducted during Week 9 (25 June - 29 June).

Stage 2A parents were notified last week that their child's Semester One Reports will be sent home tomorrow in preparation for interviews next week as Mr Tyszkiewicz will be taking long service leave in the last two weeks of this term.

Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Learning Team Visit to St Monica's.

Each term a school is approached to host an Instructional Walk for the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Learning team. Our school has been selected this term and we will host 14 leaders on Thursday, 21 June from 8:30am - 11:00am.

To start the day the team will receive input regarding our school goals, our data wall information on every student, information about project based learning and our implementation of Positive Behaviour Support for Learning and the impact that this framework has had on student learning. The team will then visit all the learning spaces and ask individual children five questions:

- What are you learning?
- How are you doing?
- How do you know?
- How can you improve?
- Where do you go for help?

The team's learning walk is part of their ongoing training to maintain shared understandings and alignment of the Learning Leaders work with schools.

Lost property- A helpful solution!

I know that children losing articles of clothing can be a frustration for parents. Mrs Abood, as you would be aware, has placed numerous messages on Skoolbags and items in the newsletter alerting parents to unclaimed school uniform items (jackets, hats, track pants). Quite often the name has been on the found item of clothing and it has been washed off over time. We know also that trying to write a name on dark clothing can be quite tricky. We may have a helpful solution!

We have approached a company called Bright Star Kids that sell iron on name labels and this may assist in solving the problem. They are custom made and offer a wide variety of styles that parents can choose from. The labels are very easy to iron onto clothing.


Kiss and Drop— Morning

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states :

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
