Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Welcome back to the new term. I hope that the holiday break has been an opportunity to renew your child/ children's energy for the new semester. Term 3 promises to engage the children in a range of vibrant learning experiences. There will be highlights such as Grandparent's Day and St Monica's feast day and there will also be challenges and opportunities for us to live our mission " to create an environment based on Gospel values in the Mercy tradition by which our community can grow and fulfil its highest potential through quality teaching and learning."

Please remember that the first point of contact for your child's learning and wellbeing is always your child's teacher. You are then most welcome to speak with either Mrs Mason or myself.

As the students begin to work on their Term 3 goals it is important that both parents and teachers encourage them to put every effort into really focussing on the areas that were highlighted in your child's recent Parent/Teacher Interview and Semester One report.

Encouragement is one of the most important parenting and teaching skills, for the simple reason that if you can be a real encourager then everything else tends to fall into place. Children that are encouraged are more likely to take risks as learners and seize opportunities that are open to them. They are also less susceptible to peer pressure as parents who understand how encouragement works are less likely to make their children reliant on them for approval.

The following article is taken from Parenting Ideas by Michael Grose.

Encouragement derives from the French term meaning 'to give heart', which describes what true encouragement is all about!

All parents want their children to develop a strong sense of self-confidence. Many parents use praise as their primary confidence-building technique, but encouragement is a much better strategy to boost children's confidence. Encouragement is a more powerful confidence-building tool than praise and it doesn't have the adverse side effects of demotivating children or promoting sibling rivalry.

The differences between the two are slim but important. Encouragement focuses on the processes of what a child does whereas praise focuses on the end result of his or her activities. Here are five ways to encourage your child.

- 1. Focus on improvement in any skill: I am pleased to see that you are rereading over your writing and editing". You can always point out improvement no matter how small.
- 2. Highlight their efforts: "I can see that you are really trying hard to get it right." Make sure that you highlight real effort, and don't elevate lack of effort to anything more than what it is.
- Comment on their contribution: "I really appreciate your assistance in tidying up your bedroom. It makes my job easier." Children like to know when they are appreciated.
- 4. Focus on the enjoyment they get from an activity: "It's great to see you enjoying your soccer/dancing>" Highlighting fun and enjoyment is great when you want to move the focus from the scoreboard.
- 5. Show your confidence: "I know you can do this. You have attempted hard things like this in the past, and you can do it again." Communicate your confidence through your words, as well as your actions.

How many of these encouragement statements do you regularly use? If you aren't a natural encourager then choose one of these statement types and challenge yourself to use it at least five times a day for a week. If you do this encouragement will become automatic in no time.

LOST PROPERTY


Each day we are still collecting jackets, hats etc that are unlabelled.

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states :

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
