POSMS MEETING

'ThinkUKnow' Cybersafety program

An invitation was sent home last week advertising an important presentation for our next POSMs meeting by the Australian Federal Police on the cybersafety program 'ThinkUKnow' .

The ThinkUKnow presentation is on **Wednesday 22 August from 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm in the Stage 3 Learning Space** and all parents and carers are strongly encouraged to attend. At this stage only 20 parents have responded out of a possible 300 parents.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a cybersafety education program that educates parents, carers and teachers of how people are using technology, the challenges they may face online, and how to help them overcome these in a safe and ethical way.

The presentation covers issues relating to children and young people's' privacy and security online, their relationships with other users and their online reputation. It provides insight into the devices young people are using, as well as the popular websites, apps and social networking sites they're accessing.

This is a very important opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help them to be safe and responsible users of technology. There will be a chance for parents to ask questions at the end of the session. For more information, you can visit <u>www.thinkuknow.org.au</u>.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank. The program is delivered in collaboration with policing partners New South Wales Police Force, Northern Territory Police, Queensland Police, South Australia Police, Tasmania Police, Western Australia Police, as well as Neighbourhood Watch Australasia.

The presentation will be delivered by Dane Stephen from the Australian Federal Police and Isabel Boniface from Microsoft.

Administration of Medication During School Hours

Parents are reminded of the procedures regarding administering medication as per our Parent Handbook guidelines.

Medication

Staff are under no legal obligation to administer medication or supervise the administration of medication. *The taking of medication at school should be absolutely avoided unless essential*. If medication is required to be administered an "*Administration of Medication During School Hours Form*" **must be completed**. This form can be downloaded from the school website (under School Notes).

<u>All medication</u> brought to the office for administration <u>must</u> have a <u>pharmacy label with the student's name and dosage details</u>.

In the case of Schedule 5 medication (Ritalin and Dexamphetamine) children will be supervised selfadministering this medication.

Office Staff will keep a register of the administration of these regular medications.

Parents of children on this medication should provide the office with:

- 1. A direction written by the prescribing Doctor and parents, of the dosages and time for the giving of the medication by the Office Staff.
- 2. One weekly supply of the medication which will be held in the office in a secure place.
- 3. Notice of any variation of time or dosage should be followed by a new direction written by the prescribing Doctor and parents.
- 4. The school must be kept informed of any other medication your child is taking including 'over the counter' preparations.



New mobile phone camera detection laws

From July 1, the new mobile phone camera detection laws came into effect. This means that mobile detection cameras are now in use in NSW and with new technology, the specialised cameras can see into your vehicle and also track you continuously for 50m. Look at the tables attached to see when you can and cannot use a mobile



(Learner, P1 and P2 licence holders are not permitted to use a mobile phone at all while driving or riding). Fines start at \$330 and 4 demerit points. This fine is also double demerit applicable. Be alert and drive safely.

While driving or riding you	CAN use your mobile phone:
V To make or answer a call	ONLY if the phone is either: In a cradle fixed to the vehicle and doesn't obscure your
✓ To use the audio playing function (e.g. music)	 view of the road can be operated without touching any part of the phone, such as via Bluetooth or voice activation
As a driver's aid (e.g. navigation, Speed Adviser app)	ONLY if the phone is in a cradle fixed to the vehicle and doesn't obscure your view of the road

While driving or riding you CANNOT use your mobile phone for anything else, including:

X Texting or audio texting	
Emailing	
Vsing social media	 If you want to use your phone for any of these functions, your vehicle must be parked out of the line of traffic
Taking photos	 These functions are not permitted when your vehicle is stopped, including when waiting at traffic lights or stuck
Video messaging	in traffic
Holding your phone in any way (in hand, on lap, between shoulder and ear). Drivers are only allowed to hold a phone to pass it to a passenger.

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states :

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
