Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

This week is Child Protection Week.

"Child abuse and neglect is preventable. If we all work together as a community we can create an Australia where all children can grow up safe and well. What role can you play in supporting children and their families?" - *Richard Cooke, CEO, National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse (NAPCAN)*

NAPCAN invites everyone to get involved with National Child Protection Week and play your part in creating safe and nurturing environments for all Australian children. We all have a role to play in protecting children from harm. By building stronger communities, we can create safer environments for our children

Research tells us that a strong community is important for children and helps them to thrive and be safe. The little things we do every day can help to create safer environments for children. Below are a few examples of a way all adults can assist children to be safe:

- Be kind to children and parents and respect young people.
- Be a good role model around children.
- Look out for signs of abuse or neglect; if you suspect something is wrong talk to an expert.
- Always take reports of abuse seriously.
- Avoid blame and don't judge; instead, ask yourself what you can do to help.

Plenary Council 2020


In 2020 the entire Catholic Church bishops, priests, religious men and women and laity will be represented at a general conference in Adelaide called the Plenary Council. This will be the first Plenary Council in Australia since 1937. Laity were not represented at that Council. The world and the Catholic Church have changed a lot since 1937. Vatican 2, the great ecumenical Council in the 1960s, massively restructured the Church.

To plan for the 21st century the Catholic Church in Australia needs to likewise restructure and reform.

The Plenary Council has the approval of Pope Francis and all its decisions are subject to ratification by Pope Francis. There have only been 5 such Councils in Australia since the arrival of the first Catholics in 1788. Each has been concerned with addressing the issues of the day and ensuring that the Church is equipped to handle the challenges of society.

Preparing for the 21st century and the enormous changes in Western society is the real and difficult task facing the 2020 Plenary Council. For the first time in Australia the voice of the laity is to be heard. Between now and 6 March 2019 everyone will be asked to consider the question, "What do you think God is asking of us at this time?"

More information will be promoted within the Parish in the coming weeks and at the next POSMS meeting on Wednesday 24 October in Term 4 we will discuss how all parents in the school can participate in the Plenary process.

On Tuesday 26th August it was my privilege to accompany the students to visit our sister school at McCarthy Catholic College Trade Training Centre Open Day. The staff at the College were very keen to showcase their students' work and the level of interest and engagement by the students, at the school, was very evident. They organised games, gardening, dress ups in a particular profession, a large Jenga game, patting of their animals, shampooing hair and playing with Ooblik to name a few. Our students were rewarded with McCarthy money which they could spend at a mini gift shop the McCarthy students had organised especially for our children.

The McCarthy students leave with level 3 certificates, work experience and an HSC. 96% of the students who attend McCarthy Catholic Trade Training School stay in employment which is much more than the 51% of students who leave school and begin a trade. Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states :

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
