Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

This week the Catholic Church is celebrating two significant days that are very closely linked. Tomorrow is the Feast of All Saints and on Friday we celebrate All Souls Day. Over these two special days we celebrate the mystery of the communion of Saints, that is, the 'Holy' people whom our Church has recognised.

The Feast of All Saints is a holy day as we believe that saints encourage and inspire us by the quality and courage that they have lived their own grace-filled lives. While we have information about many saints, and we honour them on specific days, there are many unknown or unsung saints, who may have been forgotten, or never been specifically honoured.

Saints, of course, are all around us. There are men and women whose generous spirit reflect the Gospel's call to love and serve God and others. Then there are the hidden saints of our daily lives, those who, unknowingly, have inspired us. Some of these people do it by making the ordinary through a spirit of simplicity and humility. Some do it by demonstrating extraordinary courage in sickness and adversity. Then there are others that rally against injustice and working tirelessly to bring about equality and dignity to others. Everyone, I'm sure, knows a quiet saint who will never be canonised but has shown us something of how to live as a follower of Christ. These are the people whose faith leads them to be generous, kind, patient and full of hope.

All Souls Day on Friday 2 November has its roots in the sixth century Benedictine tradition of praying to the dead. It was a way of recognising the human bonds which go beyond death. By the tenth century this feast was all about praying for the dead, that they might know the merciful love of God. We remember in prayer, family members or friends who have died this year. During the month of November we pray for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

While the Feast of All Saints is a day to remember the glories of Heaven and those there already, the Feast of all Souls reminds us of our obligations to live holy lives and to continue to pray for those souls that may not have been received into Heaven (yet!)

Mercíful Father,

hear our prayer and console us as we renew our faith in Your Son whom you raised from the dead. Strengthen our hope that all our departed brothers and sisters will share in His resurrection, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, One God for ever and ever. Amen.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, And let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.


Parents and their daughters have the opportunity to tour the school campus at one of our upcoming school tours specifically for Year 7 2020 applicants, but open to any year group.

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states :

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
