Every learner, every day

Attendance at school has direct impact on a student's academic success. Families play a key role in ensuring that their child/children come to school every day.

Some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. However, when students miss too many days from school it can cause them to fall behind academically. Absences can add up very quickly and if a student is away one day a fortnight they would in fact miss one month of school (20 days).

If your child is absent from school a letter addressed to your child's teacher is required on the day that they return to school.

We want every student at St Monica's to be successful at school and we know you do too. If parents have a problem with their child attending school regularly, please let us know. We will support you and work together for a solution.

Keeping the students safe

Every day our external school gates are locked to keep all our students and staff safe. This ensures that all visitors to our school report to the school office before entering the school grounds. Last year a camera was installed at the office gate as extra security.

The external gates are locked after all parents leave the school after morning assembly and a chat with other parents. The gates and the car park double gates are reopened at 2:45 pm. Parents arriving at this time are able to leave their car on the line and interact with other parents until dismissal time at 3:00 pm.

Dealing with playground issues

Please go through the correct channels when an issue arises concerning your child and another student. Let matters relating to children be dealt with at school by our staff. Please do not approach children or parents when an issue occurs. Approaching someone else's child translates into a Child Protection issue that can be avoided if the issue is brought to the attention of the child's teacher or a member of the School Leadership Team.

Afternoon Car Line

To assist the teachers on duty each afternoon please display your family name card clearly under the driver's sun visor. This assists teachers in locating the students quickly.

Mathematical Assessment Interview (MAI)

Thank you to all the parents who were able bring their child/children along to the MAI last week. As many more families made appointments this year the teachers have now completed all the assessments and we are currently analysing every student's results.

At our staff meeting this afternoon the teachers will be using the data to plan their focus for the warm up component of their mathematics lesson over the next few weeks. This information will be shared with parents at the Stage information nights next week.

Any student who arrives after the morning bell (8:50 am) must attend the office to be signed in by their parent. Students who attend the office, without a parent, will be given a red LATE ARRIVAL slip which is to be given to the teacher. Parents will receive a note (in an envelope) to be signed and returned to the office the next day. Late arrivals / absences are recorded as Unexplained until we receive written notification from parents. Thank you for your co-operation.

Our Dance Fever programme will commence this Friday 8 February. Students are to wear their sport uniform.

Medical Action Plans (including Anaphylaxis and Asthma)

Medical Action Plans are required to be updated by your child's doctor **each year** and a **copy is to be given to the School Office.** Yearly updates are required so that we are kept informed of any changes in your child's requirements. Epipens and Asthma puffers are kept in the Sick Bay.

Medication

Staff are under no legal obligation to administer medication or supervise the administration of medication. *The taking of medication at school should be absolutely avoided unless essential*.

If medication is required to be administered an "*Administration of Medication During School Hours Form*" must be completed. This form can be downloaded from the school website (under School Notes)

All medication brought to the office for administration <u>must</u> have a <u>pharmacy label</u> with the student's name and dosage details.

Mobile Phones

Each year parents who request permission for their child to bring a mobile phone to school are asked to do so **in writing** to the Principal.

Students who brought phones to school last year are therefore required to provide a letter this year explaining the need for the phone at school.

Permission is only granted to those students who travel home on a bus or who walk home. On arrival at school the switched off phone is to be handed in at the School Office where the student is to sign in the phone. In the afternoon the phone will be sent to the classroom via the office bags. Students are to switch the phone on and place the phone in their school bag before leaving school.

Anaphylaxis / Allergies—Food Awareness

A number of students at school suffer from anaphylaxis and allergies. In order for us to provide for the needs of all our students we ask that you **only send food to school** that is **nut free.** Thank you for your co-operation.

Pow Wow

For a number of years Pow Wow (playgroup for pre-schoolers-babies - 5 years) has been very active within our community. Most of the children from the Pow Wow group in 2018 started Kindergarten this year and were part of this group for a number of years. We are now looking to start with a new group of parents and children.

Pow Wow is held in the Community Room each Monday during school terms between 9:00am - 10:30 am.
