Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

I am very pleased to be back at St Monica's after my long service leave.. It was lovely to see all the children happy in their learning environment. I have certainly been given a full detailed report on what has happened during my absence (from a child's perspective!).

I would sincerely like to thank Mrs Leanne Nettleton for her strong leadership leading the school in my absence.

During my leave I went on a pilgrimage with my parish to Israel. I was very fortunate to visit Nazareth, Jericho, Tiberias, Bethlehem and Jerusalem. Beyond the architecture or the interiors of these places, it was their significance that overwhelmed me. To follow the path where Jesus walked, to see where he spent the final days of his life, to touch the spot where He was crucified – all of it was moving and memorable. How quickly everything changes in Israel. from city to desert, from one religion to another, from intense culture to untouched nature... this is a land of extremes all packed into a very small space.

The Holy city of Jerusalem alone could easily fill your entire itinerary as the energy it exudes is unforgettable. You can easily step back in time as much of Jerusalem still retains the classic architecture, art, and culture from biblical times.



Witnessing the faith of pilgrims from all over the world is an experience in itself. But perhaps what made the most impact on me was that being there made everything that I have learned growing up come to life.

You enter Jerusalem and head over to the walled Old City. In just one small area, 0.9 square kilometres to be exact, you will wander around four very different quarters — Muslim, Jewish. Christian and Armenian.

Within the walls of the city our group made the Stations of the Cross walking close to the area where Jesus made his final steps to where He was finally crucified. In the Christian quarter is the location of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, where we joined the hundreds of people from all over the world who have made a pilgrimage to witness the location where Jesus was crucified and thought to be buried. It's also where Jesus is believed to have been resurrected.

I look forward to sharing my experience with you all as we progress through the Liturgical Year.

#### Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese.

In part this states:

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.
