This involved discussion on:

- what makes successful feedback
- what it means to give comprehensive feedback (teacher to student, student to teacher, teacher to teacher)
- what it means to obtain meaningful feedback
- what misunderstood feedback can involve
- modelling for students what appropriate feedback looks like and sounds like.

Here are a few sentence starters that the teachers use when giving feedback to the students (*teacher to student*).

You may like to use them at home with your children.

- Is there another strategy you could use to prove your answer?
- What changes would you make to improve.....?
- If you were viewing your own piece of work, what would you have to say about it?
- How does this piece of work demonstrate that you know....?
- How have you improved in your writing and how do you know?

Citizenship / Changes to Visa status

If parents or students become Australian citizens at any time during the year, could you please provide a copy of your certificate to the school office so that we can update your child's enrolment file.

Please also advise the office if there are any changes to your Visa status so that we can make the necessary amendments. Thank you.

Notice of Intention to Remove a Student from St Monica's School

The Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Office has developed a Policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese. In part this states:

"A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term."

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.





Legal requirements

Correct child car seats for children's age and size

All children must be safely fastened in the correct child car seat for their age and size. A child who is properly secured in an approved child car seat is less likely to be injured or killed in a car crash than one who is not.



Up to 6 months

Approved rear facing child car seat.



6 months to 4 years 4+ years

Car seat safety is in the media quite a lot at the moment and with statistics showing more than a third of children under 13 who died on NSW roads in the 10 years to 2016 would probably have survived if they had been properly restrained in a children's car seat or with a seat belt, is quite alarming.

Here is the most up to date information we could share as a reminder to our parents.

National child restraint laws

- Children up to the age of six months must be secured in an approved rearward facing restraint
- Children aged from six months old but under four years old must be secured in either a rear or forward facing approved child restraint with an inbuilt harness
- Children under four years old cannot travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows
- Children aged from four years old but under seven years old must be secured in a forward facing approved child restraint with an inbuilt harness or an approved booster seat
- Children aged from four years old but under seven years old cannot travel in the front seat
 of a vehicle with two or more rows, unless all other back seats are occupied by children
 younger than seven years in an approved child restraint or booster seat
- Children aged from seven years old but under 16 years old who are too small to be
 restrained by a seatbelt properly adjusted and fastened are strongly recommended to use
 an approved booster seat
- Children in booster seats must be restrained by a suitable lap and sash type approved seatbelt that is properly adjusted and fastened, or by a suitable approved child safety harness that is properly adjusted and fastened.

If your child is too small for the child restraint specified for their age, they should be kept in their current child restraint until it is safe for them to move to the next level.

If your child is too large for the child restraint specified for their age, they may move to the next level of child restraint.


From a booster seat to a seatbelt

Your child should be moved when:

- o Their shoulders no longer fit comfortably within the booster seat; or
- o Their eye-level is higher than the back of the booster seat; or
- If your child car seat has shoulder marks, move your child to a seatbelt when his/her shoulders have passed the upper marks.

This five-step test can help assess whether your child is big enough to be safely restrained by a seatbelt. The child should be able to:

- 1. Sit with their back against the seat back
- 2. Bend their knees comfortably over the front of the seat cushion
- 3. Sit with the sash belt across their mid-shoulder
- 4. Sit with the lap belt across the top of their thighs
- 5. Remain in this position for the whole trip.
