Dear Parents, Staff and Students,

Tomorrow we will celebrate the *Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Australia's first recognised saint. St Mary MacKillop was recognised as a person of integrity who gave loving service to the marginalised and poor and particularly to children through education.*

Mary's childhood was both extraordinary and at times incredibly challenging. Like all parents, her father and mother influenced her formation greatly and with her decision to become a Josephite nun.

Her father, Alexander, had studied to become a priest, but before his ordination he had a disagreement with the leader of his religious order and didn't pursue his studies. He was a very intelligent man and often had disagreements with people as he shared his beliefs. He was known not to back down. This behaviour impacted on his work situation where he wasn't able to keep steady employment and as a result the family was often destitute and had to rely on the kindness of other people in order to survive. Mary learnt from this experience about strength of character and honesty.

Mary's mother, Flora, was staunchly supportive of her husband through thick and thin. She forgave him for his tendency to want to help others at all costs, even at the expense of his own family. From her mother, Mary certainly learnt about loving, forgiveness, compassion and tolerance.

Her childhood wasn't idyllic as I'm sure that she would have experienced many disappointments and she would have had many challenges to overcome. Whatever their shortcomings Mary's mother and father were able to impart lessons with both their strengths and failings. It was through this experience of family that Mary acquired her deep faith, strong resilience and incredible tenacity to overcome adversity.

Alexander's and Flora's abiding love for their daughter, their compassion for the needs of others, their strong faith as well as the difficulties of her childhood inspired their daughter, Mary, to take up her vocation of service as a Josephite Sister.

A well known saying by St Mary MacKillop was 'Never see a need without doing something about it.' Her dedication to the poor and marginalised was a key element to her ministry and it is certainly something that we all can emulate in our own way. Empowering our children to take on small responsibilities both at school and at home assists them in recognising that they are able to contribute to the family, school and the community. Sometimes it can be easy for parents and teachers to do things for children instead of promoting a sense of service and self efficacy through experiences. Self efficacy is the strength of one's belief in one's own ability to complete tasks and reach goals.

In all learning spaces this week the teachers are focusing on the qualities of St Mary MacKillop and how we might apply these in the living of our own lives. Care, perseverance, honesty, compassion and humility are certainly values that our world needs more action on.

All families are very welcome to attend our school mass tomorrow at **9:15 am** at St Monica's Church.



Around the Classrooms

In the last newsletter I wrote to all families about the work that we are all focused on in all learning spaces ie feedback. All teachers use learning intentions and success criteria to focus their students on the specific learning in each of their lessons. Teachers don't just state the intent, they discuss what the learning will be about and what success will look like when they complete the related task. The learning intention and the success criteria are then constantly referred to as the lesson unfolds.

The success criteria is co-constructed with the students actively involved in devising the criteria. The more that the student is aware of the criteria of success, then the more the student can understand the specific actions that are required. Students can then self assess their completed work and receive specific feedback from their teacher or peers.

Below are a variety of learning intentions and success criteria from all classes in our school. Please feel free whenever you are up in the learning space to view these in your own child's class and also in other learning spaces.

Learning Intention
To compose and edit a well structured and coherent imaginative text.

Success Criteria

- I can use sophisticated, emotive, descriptive language
- I can produce and present a variety of sentence types.
- I can assess whether or not I need to include a complication and resolution.
- I can continue to captivate my reader in my writing.

Length
Learning intention:
We are learning to describe and compare length and distance using everyday language.

Success criteria:

- I can measure an object from end to end.
- I can use everyday language to describe length and distance. eg. Long, Short, near, far, close, tall
- I can use everyday language to compare length and distance eg. longer, shorter, longest, closer, closest

Learning Intention
We are writing a description of the Gruffalo.

Success Criteria:

I can:

- start each sentence with a capital
- use full stops at the end. !?
- use different beginnings for my sentences. The Gruffalo/ He has....
- use adjectives (describing words) how words. ...as big as
- make my sentences interesting
- use joining words
- re-read to see if it makes sense.
- check my spelling
- read to someone else to get feedback

Task:
Explore the movements of three dimensional shapes and justify their ability to move.

Driving Question

Learning Intention:
We are learning to explore the movement of three dimensional shapes and justify their ability to move.

Success Criteria:

- I can name a variety of three dimensional shapes and identify properties of each.
- I can investigate the way three dimensional shapes are made.
- I can explore the way three dimensional shapes move (translate, rotate, reflect)
- I can construct and manipulate a variety of three dimensional shapes.
- I can estimate and accurately measure the distance, time and movement a three dimensional shape will move when projected from an inclined ramp.
- I can justify and provide reasons why 3D objects move in particular ways on different surfaces.

Thank you prayers.

Learning Intention
We are learning how to write prayers saying thank you to God for the people who love and care for us.

Success Criteria

- I can write 'Dear God' at the beginning of my prayer on its own line.
- I can write a sentence praising God. ~~and a sentence~~
- I can write a sentence thanking God for those who love and care for me.
- I can write a sentence saying sorry for not always appreciating those who love and care for me.
- I can write a sentence asking God for his help to show those people that I appreciate them.
- I can write a sentence telling God 'yes' that you will do your very best to be more appreciative.
- I can write Amen at the end of my prayer on its own line.

Attendance Extend Absences/Student Leave for reasons other than illness.

In 2012 new guidelines were introduced for schools to follow when marking the roll. These new guidelines require parents who are taking their children on holidays during the school terms to complete a request for ***Application for Extended Leave Form (A1)***

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason other than illness or a school related event you are required notify the Class Teacher/Principal in writing with a full explanation of the reason for leave. Students who will be away from school for **more than 5 days** are required to submit an ***Application for Extended Leave Form (A1)*** for approval by the Principal. This will then be processed by the Principal and an approved exemption letter will be supplied to you. The ***Application for Extended Leave Form (A1)*** is available on the school website (under School Notes) and also through the school office, These forms must be completed **before taking your holiday**. The School Principal can only approve up to 50 days leave. Longer periods need the approval of the Minister for Education through the Catholic Education Commission.

Once the forms have been completed and returned, you will then be issued with a certificate allowing the exemption from school. This certificate, once issued, needs to be kept with you while on holidays in case you are requested to present it to authorised attendance officers or police. If the absence from school is longer than 20 days a copy of travel documents will need to be supplied to support the request for exemption. If an absence from school is longer than 100 school days then the request will need to be supported by an explanation and a copy of relevant travel documents. This application will be processed by the Principal and forwarded to the Catholic Education Office. A copy of the Guidelines for Exemption for attendance at NSW Catholic Systemic Schools' in its entirety is available on request from the school office.

Mufti Days

In the previous newsletter and in the letter sent home to all families requesting items for our parent organised Trivia Night, you would have noticed we are inviting children to wear Mufti on Friday 16 August.

When the school has a Mufti Day it means that the children do not have to wear their school uniform. They may wear smart casual clothing and their sport shoes on that day.

On **Friday 16 August** children are requested on this particular mufti day to **bring along an item for our Trivia Night. Hamper items will be collected from 8:20am onwards near the school gates.** All donations are greatly appreciated.

Please be very patient in the morning when you are dropping off children in the Kiss and Drop Zone as we have noticed that some drivers are finding it very hard to get out on to North Rocks Road which is resulting in a line of traffic within our school driveway.

In order for our Kiss and Drop process to run smoothly, families are requested to be courteous to other drivers and adhere to the guidelines below.

The following guidelines apply for safety reasons:

Morning Kiss and Drop

- Cars **must enter the school grounds via Daking Street only**
- Students must always **exit the car via the driver's side only**.
- Farewell parents before getting out of the car
- **Parents are not to get out of the car** to get bags out of the boot or to farewell children. Bags should be with children ready to exit the car.
- Children walk into the school grounds via the gate.
- Parents are always welcome to park their car and walk their child/children into the school grounds if they are not able to comply with the safety requests in the "Kiss and Drop" zone.

- Parents are reminded that there is no waiting in our car park from 3:15pm onwards.
- Please consider delaying your arrival after school as the students are well supervised until 3:30pm. (Please note that teacher supervision ceases at 3:30pm Monday—Friday)

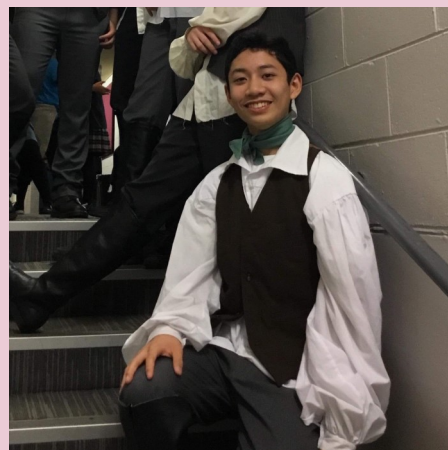

Costumes can be made from recycled things around your home - please do not feel like you need to purchase something new!

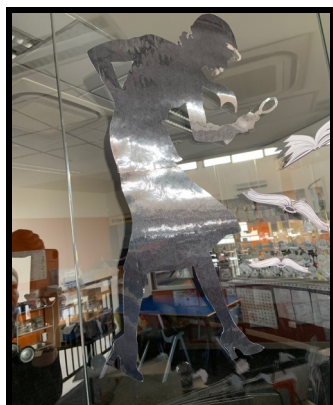
The most imaginative costumes in each class will win a prize. Students can parade with a copy of the book if they have one.
