NAPLAN (National Assessment Program Literacy And Numeracy) Years 3 and 5 (Term 2, Week 3)

NAPLAN Online testing will commence on Tuesday 12 May 2020

It is important that all students in Years 3 and 5 attend school during NAPLAN testing.

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format.

Our library monitors & Mrs Davino are in the library during these times to help any students.


The St Monica's message bag or a material/cloth bag can be used to protect borrowed books.
