Dear Parents and Carers,

Last Wednesday, the Gospel reading was about the vine and the branches (Jn 15:1-8). It's a story about how intimately connected Jesus is to each of his followers and how much the vine relies on the branches to grow and produce fruit. It reminded me of the connection between home and school, particularly evident in the midst of a pandemic. The school, founded on Catholic values, and the family, are reliant on each other for the fruit to grow. The branches need their connection to the vine for nourishment, and the vine needs the branches because that's where the fruit grows.



Pope Francis, when speaking about the Gospel, said "Without Jesus we can do nothing, like branches without the vine...it's the Lord who says it - without us it seems that he cannot do anything because the branch bears the fruit, not the tree."

At St Monica's, we cannot ensure the fruit flourishes without you, the parents and families of our students. In the Gospel, we are reminded of this and I want to thank you for your ongoing support and partnership. On Monday, we welcome all students back full-time. We are looking forward to the normalcy that being back at school every day provides, as we are sure you are.

We have made some changes to our procedures to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students and staff, including additional cleaning through the day of touchpoints, availability of hand sanitiser within learning spaces and clear expectations around frequent hand washing. There will be no large gatherings until further notice, including assemblies and liturgies.

Due to the ongoing social distancing requirements for adults, we request that parents do not enter the school grounds. If you need to communicate with your child's teacher or our office staff, please enter the school via the Daking Street office. We encourage all students to be picked up, where possible, via Kiss 'n' Ride. If this is not possible, students will need to be collected from the carpark gate near the parish hall. Parents must maintain social distancing protocols at this time. Kiss 'n' Ride will continue to operate until 3:30pm so please consider delaying afternoon pick up to prevent traffic congestion. Thank you for your understanding.

Please do not send your child to school if they are sick, or if they are exhibiting any symptoms of cold and flu, including cough, runny nose or fever. If students become sick while at school, we will contact you to come and pick them up.

The following procedures apply to all schools within Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta. From Monday, all learning will occur at school. There will no longer be the provision of any remote learning as this is not sustainable with all children expected back at school. Attendance procedures will return to normal and students will be marked as absent if they do not attend school. The 'flexible' mode no longer applies, therefore parents will be required to provide an absent note to explain the absence, as per normal.

Please contact the school via email or phone if you are choosing not to send your child/ren back to school on Monday. I understand these decisions will impact many families and I would love the opportunity to discuss your family's circumstances with you.

Again, I would like to acknowledge the dedication and professionalism displayed by St Monica's staff during this challenging and ever-changing time. Thank you also to the families for being supportive and understanding, and to the parish community for keeping us all in their prayers.




Reporting

At St Monica's, we believe that you, the parents and carers of our students, have made a significant contribution to your child's learning this year and as such, are taking the opportunity to involve you in the reporting process for your child. Flexibility in this process for Semester 1, 2020 has been provided by the Minister for Education. However, this opportunity is one in which we anticipate will continue at St Monica's in 2021 and beyond.

Assessment and reporting at St Monica's in 2020 is a year-long, collaborative approach, where all major stakeholders are involved:

- In Term One, we established learning goals with every student.
- In Term Two, we will invite parents to participate in a Progress Learning Conference (via Zoom) with their child and their child's teacher. This conference will include students demonstrating evidence of learning, and teachers and parents collaborating to report on progress in Religion, English and Mathematics. New and/or revised learning goals will be established for every student. As grades, comparative data and a written report are not a requirement for Semester 1, 2020, reporting will be via the collaborative conference only.
- In Term Three, students will work with their teachers and parents to continue to meet their learning goals and regularly evaluate and co-construct new ones.
- Finally, in Term Four, a cumulative written report will be prepared and distributed to students
 and their parents as an artefact of the year's learning, including grades from A-E, comparative
 data and written comments.



Phases of Reporting at St Monica's: Creating Sustainable Learning Partnerships

The proposed changes to our reporting processes have been developed in consultation with our teachers and we will also be seeking parent feedback after the conclusion of the Progress Learning Conferences. These conferences (via Zoom) will be held during Weeks 9 and 10 of Term Two with further details regarding times and bookings to be provided soon.

We look forward to meeting with you and continuing the sustainable learning partnerships between students, teachers and parents.
